SCRIPTURE * Mark 11:1-11 Jesus Comes to Jerusalem as King 1 As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, 2 saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. 3 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' tell him, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly." 4 They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, 5 some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" 6 They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. 7 When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. 8 Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. 9 Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted, "Hosanna!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" 10 "Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David!" "Hosanna in the highest!" 11 Jesus entered Jerusalem and went into the temple. He looked around at everything, but since it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the Twelve.

Meals and help offered by our New Cumberland Senior's center.

Benefits ANYONE 60 and older. Bagged lunches are served every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 11:30 - noon (only one half hour). In order to receive these bags they must be ordered the day before by 11 a.m. For instance, if you want the Monday lunch, you must place your reservation by 11 Friday morning. There is a gentleman who brings leftovers to the Senior Center on Wednesdays that he brings from the Veterans Food Bank. Those items are also distributed on Wednesdays but it is first come, first served. On Thursdays they receive bread from Giant and clients may have one bread and one sweet along with their bagged lunch. Whenever there are extras of anything they're added to their bagged lunch.

The phone number to call to make your reservation is 717-774-0409. You must leave your name and phone number and how many lunches. These are catered lunches.


