From Your Pastor's Heart

Easter greetings my dear Friend!

It was in the mid-1990s and I was leading a Bible study in Bangalore, India. During our discussion time, one of the members said, "The Christian life is a very difficult life to live". Almost immediately another member said, "May I beg to differ with you, please?". The person went on to speak of however since he accepted Christ as his Savior the Christian life was nothing short of a joy and a pleasure, even during the most difficult days. He went on to say, "If I try to live this Christian life in my own strength, I believe I will be beaten and down. But when I live in Christ's strength, this life is nothing short of a life of victory and joy!"

Easter reminds me of the words of Warren W. Wiersbe, "We are not fighting for victory. We are fighting from victory". As you appropriate the gift of Easter, may I invite you to think of these promises from God's Word:

What a privilege to know that "He who began a good work in us will bring it to completion". Phil 1:6

What an encouragement to remember that "Death has been swallowed up in victory". 1 Cor. 15:54

What a joy to remember that the Lord Jesus declared, "Because I live, you also will live". John 14:19

What an assurance to think of the promise of our Lord Jesus, "Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life". John 5: 24

What a sure promise of eternity we receive when we hear the words, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die". John 11:25

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

The Resurrection reminds us of the Lord's question in Jeremiah 32:27: "I am the LORD, the God of all mankind. Is anything too hard for me?"

There are times in our lives when we struggle to make sense of things. Some of us could be facing such a time right now. A time in which too many things seem to go wrong at the same time. Not too many days ago, I was on the phone with someone who said, "I don't know what else can go wrong now. I think everything that possibly could go wrong has gone wrong in my life!" For a lighter moment let me share these words from my sermon preached on March 14th, 2021. "Sometimes in life we feel like everything is happening all at the same time. Have you had a moment like this? The doorbell and the telephone begin to ring at the same time, the timer on the oven goes off at the same time, the baby wakes up and begins to cry at the same time and your 2-year-old wants restroom help at the same time. Your pet is vying for your attention at the same time. You probably just want to scream and run away - at the same time!"

On a more serious note, what about days when the teenager has tantrums and struggles that you wish you could wish away? Or your elderly parents seem to be falling apart? Or the coronavirus has made your work environment a lot more challenging and your medical report indicates you might have an upcoming surgery. You probably feel like you are being lowered into a blazing furnace and the flames are about to burn you away.

Jesus faced such moments too. The night before he was crucified gives us a window-view into how his struggles compounded. He was betrayed by a friend, denied by another, falsely accused, wrongfully charged, and unfairly condemned to the most horrific death on a Roman cross.

Have you had a time in your life when you were ridiculed by some, abandoned by friends, taunted by critics, and violated by enemies? A time at which you felt the flames from the inferno of doubt, darkness, and even death threats to destroy your soul?

Don't look far. Easter is proof that God is at work in the fiercest furnace to bring forth his gold!

FEARLESS TO DO GOD'S WORK

Thanks to all of you who have been praying and sharing ideas about how we can take the work of our Lord forward at Trinity. Please keep sharing them with us.

I am reaching out to seek your help in a few new opportunities. May I ask if you might be willing to:

• Join us in our new "Pray and Go' door-to-door prayer ministry initiative. Join us for our April study series of learning before going. Who knows how one church might be able to pray for the people of New Cumberland and beyond! To know more, see the announcement.

• Introduce our "Sermon by phone" short message initiative with someone who doesn't use the internet. This could be a friend at Trinity or someone beyond our congregation. See the announcement for details.

• Talk the Children's talk with your children in the family. How about a mid-week conversation and prayer with your child/ children using the video of the weekly children's talks? See the announcement for details.

• Invite a youth to worship with us online or in person. Youth will respond best when they know we care for them and love them. Tell them that our services now include a Praise and Worship Time in song – and of the Skitguys who do even better than the Indian pastor with their humor. Tell them about Youth Group.

• Invite a young family to Trinity. How about praying and working towards seeing at least 20 new young families join our congregation in the next two years? Tell them the church is investing in a new nursery for kids and is engaged in a children's ministry weekly. Can you write down the name of a family you might be able to invite and start praying for them?

• Invite a friend who has stopped attending any church or has never attended church to join us for our outreach events like the Starfish ministry time at Harrisburg. Some people are doers. They connect better with the language of service.

• Share the Gospel with one new person in the next 3 months. Pray for a person that you might be able to share with. Pray daily. Connect. Listen. Share your story of faith. Ask your friend if he/she would be interested in knowing more. Share a Bible if they are willing to accept one. Pray with them. Invite them to Church. Share a link to a service/ message/prayer time/ music time/ from Trinity.

My name is Amy Gross and I am the School Social Worker for West Shore School District. I cover and work with students K-12 in all 14 of our schools. I have had the privilege of working with Cathy Baum for the last two years with your congregations A.S.K. Program. Since April 2019 you have donated and amazing 145 boxes of food as well as toiletries to our students in need. Words cannot express how grateful we are for these donations!

This past year has brought about many families and students who are struggling financially, who have never been in this situation before. Many students come to school hungry or only get meals while at school. This food has been given to kids in school, to have snacks and extra food for meals. It has also been delivered to our homeless families who live in the motels off Limekiln Road and Lewisberry Road. Many of these families do not have vehicles to drive to food banks and they do not have a kitchen in the motel rooms. They do have microwaves though, so having the easy microwaveable meals and canned foods with flip top lids (as not everyone has a can opener) has been a blessing. The food is also added to our power pack bags and sent home with students so they have food on the weekend.

The A.S.K. Program has been a true blessing to help our students in need. Thank you so much for taking the time and buying these items and spending your own money to do so. You are truly making a difference in these kids' lives and helping to provide them with their basic needs so they can be more successful in school.

RESURRECTION POWER IN THE WORD - EASTER 2021

For the Word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, It penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow. It judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Hebrews 4:12

Some of you have read the scriptures all your lives, others may be new at being in the Word (the Bible), but few of us have actually looked at the Word of God as "alive and active" ready to take hold of us and perform the very Words God proclaims and yet that is exactly what God's Word says.

Jesus says, "Store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:20. Now you've read this many times, but have you ever considered that your "treasure" you are to store up is "the Word of God"? When we have the Word of God stored in our heart, we are protected from all evil, and because it is part of us (stored in our heart) we can bring it up and proclaim it every time the devil gives us a negative thought or situation.

For example, I just received a diagnosis of B Cell Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma. Now I can take that diagnosis and worry about it, I can keep speaking about the diagnose or I can speak God's Word of healing. Now am I still receiving treatment? Yes, God has given us through the inspiration of His Holy Spirit medical technology to activate the body to heal itself. Remember, we are created in the image of God, He created my inmost being He knit me together in my mother's womb" (Psalm 139:14). You see, when I know what God's Word says for my situation, I can trust in Him and His Word, believing for the results He has for me. We live by faith not by sight (2 Corinthians 5:7)
