

From Your Pastor's Heart

Dear Trinity Family,

Our sermon series from the book of Daniel has challenged us to be "Fearless to obey". Would you for a moment think of the word, "fear"?

In a Peanuts cartoon titled, "Charlie Brown's existential crisis", we are given a view of Charlie Brown talking to himself in a dark night on his bed. With palms to his cheek, he says, "My anxieties have anxieties".

In some world-views or religious systems, fear is a central emotion in devotion. There are people who are fearful of what they think are certain "bad days" in the week or certain "bad times" in the day. They engage in tedious and religious efforts to try and navigate away from those 'landmines' that they fear might bring them misfortune. It is therefore not uncommon for people in such world-views or religious systems to fear certain days and times as not safe to travel, not good to transact business upon and yes, not good to conduct a wedding in. The inevitable, of course, is that none even in such systems are able to navigate past their date or time of expiration!

The dilemma of such people – sincere as they are, will find God's answers in scriptures like these:

Psalm 31: 14,15: But I trust in you, Lord; I say, "You are my God." My times are in your hands.

Psalm 118:24: This is the day that the Lord has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it.

As believers in the Lord Jesus, we are promised that God has not given to us a spirit of fear, but of power, and of love and of a sound mind. 2 Timothy 1:7

Some years ago, I told Miriam, "You may be shocked to hear me say this, but this is what I truly believe. In case I drop dead at this moment, I would have finished my life as one of the happiest and most satisfied human beings in all the world in my age category". Why could I say that then and why would I believe it to be true even now?

It is because of the promise I have in the Lord Jesus – and in his Word. I live each day of my life – not with an unhealthy fear of God but with a sacred reverence for Him. What does that sense of reverence do? It reminds me that He is holy, He is mighty, He is the One who sets the moral standard for life, that His Holy Word is not to be reinterpreted by culture but has the power to reinterpret culture and transform lives – and yes, that He is the one who gives me my every breath and heartbeat. To reduce God to the "chum" down the street who deserves nothing more than an offering and a church visit, is to completely miss the point of who he is. The challenge we have as believers is to not fall prey to the lies of our culture. Somewhere deep inside our post-modern illusions of self-adequacy is the root of rebellion. It is a root that grows the tree of disobedience.

May your greatest fear in life not be of the unknown or even of death – but of disobedience to God. It was Mark Twain who is attributed to have this in his own style, "I am not troubled by the things in the Bible which I do not understand, but I am troubled by those things which I do understand and which I find very difficult to measure up to".

So, let me ask myself a question. Do I have fears? Yes, I do. I am as human as you are. But if you ask me what one of my biggest fears is, I can tell you straight away. It is the fear of failing God.

The Bible tells us in Psalm 128: 1: Blessed are all who fear the Lord, who walk in obedience to him. The Lord Jesus said, "If you love me, you will obey my commandments" John 14: 15

Do you want to be that kind of person in God's eyes?

Following Jesus has nothing to do with being forced. It has everything to do with being loved! Loved by a Savior who even died for us – and who in his heart desires that we will live for Him.

STORIES FROM LIFE – AND LESSONS FOR THE HEART

In my years of serving you as your servant and pastor, I trust you have evidence to believe that I have striven to be very respectful of American culture and the history and story of the people of God at Trinity. My family and I have also been blessed to be mutually respected and loved by so many of you in this very precious congregation. Unfortunately, not too long ago, I felt I was judged harshly for being an Indian. I was told words that deeply hurt and also puzzled me. Words that categorized me in a certain negative way simply because I was Indian. What I tend to do when I face moments like that is to be still and refocus my thoughts on Jesus – the perfect one in all of history and eternity. As I pondered upon Christ in the midst of my pain, I heard myself chuckle, "If they did it to him, why on earth do you think you will be spared?". Life can be harsh, but we take lessons from the tough times and allow them to shape us for times of loving and serving.

You might be aware that Indians across the US have been seen as hardworking and diligent people. I have often been thrilled to hear from some of you about your Indian-origin doctor/ physician/ surgeon. On the other hand, we also face our challenges. I remember the day Nehara came home from school and told us that a schoolmate had said that Indians are basically cab drivers in New York or own Seven Elevens or work in gas stations. She said she reminded him of the Indians in Ivy League Schools and in global leadership in various fields.

As I was pondering the words I had recently heard, a friend sent me a mail with this forward. I thought it would give you moments to appreciate how we can learn from one another across cultures as human beings in the journey of life together. These words have been attributed to Satya Nadella who is originally from Hyderabad, India. He earned a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from Mangalore University (Mangalore is where I was born), a master's degree in computer science from the University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee, and a master's degree in business administration from the University of Chicago. Nadella serves on the board of trustees to Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center and his alma mater the University of Chicago, as well as the Starbucks board of directors. He serves presently as the Chairman and CEO of Microsoft. I hope you enjoy these stories from life that bring lessons to the heart.

- 1. *LOOKING BACK* I interviewed my grandmother for part of a research paper I'm working on for my Psychology class. When I asked her to define success in her own words, she said.... *Success is when you look back at your life and the MEMORIES make you smile*
- 2. *LOVE CONQUERS PAIN* After I watched my dog get run over by a car, I sat on the side of the road holding him and crying. *And just before he died, He licked the tears off my face*
- 3. *TOGETHERNESS* As my father, my three brothers, and two sisters stood around my mother's hospital bed, my mother uttered her last coherent words before she died. She simply said, *I feel so loved right now. We should have gotten together like this more often*
- 4. *AFFECTION* I kissed my dad on the forehead as he passed away in a small hospital bed. About 5 seconds after he passed, *I realized it was the first time I had given him a kiss since I was a little boy*
- 5. *JOY* When I witnessed a 27-year-old cancer patient laughing hysterically at her 2-year-old daughter's antics, I suddenly realized that *I need to stop complaining about my life and start celebrating it again*
- 6. *KINDNESS* A boy in a wheelchair saw me desperately struggling on crutches with my broken leg and offered to carry my backpack and books for me. *He helped me all the way across campus to my class and as he was leaving he said, "I hope you feel better soon.*
- 7. *SHARING* I was traveling in Kenya and I met a refugee from Zimbabwe. He said he hadn't eaten anything in over 3 days and looked extremely skinny and unhealthy. Then my friend offered him the rest of the sandwich he was eating. *The first thing the man said was, "We can share it"*

BLANKET SUNDAY

The Church World Service Blankets+ Program is a worldwide effort to provide emergency supplies in the aftermath of a crisis. First blankets, then tents and food, then tools to rebuild and training for the future.

As people recover from disaster or adjust to resettlement, Church World Service blankets provide comfort, and shelter, can be used as a sunshade, or provide a dry place to sit and rest. Blankets are distributed wherever they are needed and may end up on the other side of the world, or in our own community.

Church World Service is a collection of 37 different denominations, including the United Methodist Church. UMCOR relies on CWS as part of its disaster response program. Supplies are ready to go at the moment they are needed.

Atlanta, Georgia Youth Mission Trip 2021
