### *From The Pastor's Heart*

My dear Trinity Family,

We made it! Is that not amazing and a testimony to grace? We made it to the end of one of the most traumatic years in modern times. In the years to follow people will read in their history books of those who lived during the time of the terrible COVID-19 pandemic. When they do, they will be reading about you and me and of all the people who shared life on this planet with us at this time.

For the optimists among us, there were good things too! The season brought families together (whether we liked it or not), brought creativity to the next level (did you not hear all those quarantine songs?). Those of us who sweat a lot saved on perfume costs – thanks to social distancing.

I wonder what you are feeling as you look back at the days that you have lived through since March of 2020. It will be no surprise if many an individual's journal entries speak of hopelessness and helplessness for most days in the year. These have not been ordinary days, weeks and months. Our world has been on edge ever since the words 'COVID-19' began to appear in our newspapers, broadcasts, television programs, web and social media pages. For a while it appeared like the problem was 'out there' until loved ones we know began to fall sick.

While our pain and loss as a global community are truly great, we also see images of human resilience and faith. I recently heard of a 91-year-old who tested positive, was quite sick for a while and then made it back to regaining health. At Trinity we have been inspired by the witness of three of our members in their nineties who chose to be present at in-person worship services when we reopened- Doris Bernardo, Betty Hannum and Jack Baumbach. Members of our congregation have been faithful in preparing and distributing love-boxes to our community under the leadership of Carol Everrtts. Others have joined Carol Crossley and Starfish Ministries to serve homeless and needy people in downtown Harrisburg. There are those among us who have joined Mickey Minnich and friends at Vickie's Angel Foundation to bring hope to families challenged by cancer. Our homebound ministry team and

youth brought cheer to members by sharing gifts of love. As a congregation your generous giving on many counts has helped us support ministries and missions that are serving people in need. Across the country and world, we have seen individuals and teams on the frontlines of the medical battle, putting themselves in harm's way to help fellow human beings. We have witnessed governmental, social and church-based organizations stretch financial and human resources to help those in need. During these dark days human stories of grace, compassion, faith and heroism have reminded us that "we are all in this together".

In their outstanding musical offering of "USA for Africa", Lionel Richie and Michael Jackson penned these words,

"There comes a time  
 When we heed a certain call  
 When the world must come together as one  
 There are people dying  
 Oh, and it's time to lend a hand to life  
 The greatest gift of all  
  
 We are the world  
 We are the children  
 We are the ones who make a brighter day, so let's start giving  
 There's a choice we're making  
 We're saving our own lives  
 It's true we'll make a better day, just you and me".

In the bigger scheme of life those who hope for a better day will find their lives galvanized by purpose. On the contrary when purpose is lost, we may find ourselves stranded anywhere between Hopeless Avenue and Dead-End Alley – or may simply be non-starters. May I suggest that there are two mindsets with which we can enter 2021 – the victim mindset or the game-changer mindset. The first will take us down, the second will lift us and others up. Yes, "there comes a time when we heed a certain call". What does that call look like in your life today?

Moses with his stammering tongue heard the call to challenge the most powerful ruler of his times.<sup>1</sup>

Gideon who saw himself as the least in the weakest clan heard the call to lead God's people.<sup>2</sup>

Jeremiah who thought of himself as a child, heard the call to be a prophet for challenging times.<sup>3</sup>

Ruth with her story of bitterness heard the call to be a sweet testament of grace.<sup>4</sup>

Rahab with her questionable past heard the call to a God-ordained future.<sup>5</sup>

Mary who was a humble young maiden, heard the call to bear the very son of God.<sup>6</sup>

Simon the fisherman heard the call to be a fisher of men.<sup>7</sup>

Zacchaeus the tax man with a story to hide became a new man with a story to tell.<sup>8</sup>

The list goes on.

In God's plan, your story is meant to be included in that list. You are not only loved by God; you are called to be an ambassador of his love. The problem arises when you don't recognize who are. Could it be that at the heart of the question of identity lies the question of security? Jesus cuts across the mist of insecurity and sees people for who they are. He not only sees them for who they are, he sees them for what they were meant to become. Too many lives have been haunted by the question, "What am I?" That question defined by our cultural moments throws light on struggles ranging from identity issues those based on the color of skin to human sexuality. As we look into the Scriptures and the heart of God, we may be redirected to another question, "Who am I?". In that question we can find the path to God-given security that defines God-given identity. "Who am I?" A child of God. Loved by the Father. Purchased by the blood of the Son. A forgiven sinner. A saint in the making. A child of the King. An agent of hope. An ambassador of love. The list goes on.

It is no surprise that in his early call to discipleship, the Lord Jesus said, “Follow me and I will make you.....” <sup>9</sup>

We are called to follow Jesus.

It is his commitment to make something beautiful out of our lives.

If we are true followers of Jesus, two elements will be an integral part of our purpose on this planet. One is to grow in our love for the Lord daily and in that to become a little more like Jesus with every passing moment. The other is to unreservedly and fearlessly share the love of Jesus with those who come into our lives. May I suggest that you ask yourself two questions at the end of every day in 2021.

Question 1: Did I become a little more like Jesus today?

Question 2: Did I share the love of Jesus with someone who needed it today?

These two simple questions have had a special place in my heart over many years. Simply put, they have the potential to change the purpose of your life radically. Since we moved from India in 2014 Miriam, Nihal and Nehara have heard me say this repeatedly, “Let us not forget that God did not primarily bring us to the US to give us a better life but to share the better Gospel”. That is a motivation that drives my life every single day.

If you have been part of Trinity over the last six years, you would be aware that it has been my practice as your pastor to help you focus on a theme for each year. After prayer and thought I am happy to share that our theme for 2021 will be “**Fearless**”. I pray that each of us will live our lives with courage not only to get through these challenging days but to also get through to our families, community, neighbors, friends, colleagues and even strangers with the love and the Gospel of Christ, fearlessly.

I am completing writing this letter on an important day in the history of modern America. It is the day on which some people have received the first doses of the approved vaccines against COVID 19. Could you for a moment imagine what it might be like if those whose research led to the creation of the vaccine selfishly kept it to themselves while billions of people suffer? Christians who know God’s love and keep it to themselves would be no different. Billions of people are experiencing hell on earth without knowing God’s love and are facing an eternity without hope not knowing the way to heaven. As singer Keith Green sang, could it be that “The world is sleeping in the dark that the church just can’t fight cause it’s sleeping in the light”?

Let me say this as best as I can:

***A church that keeps the Gospel a secret is soon bound to become one!***

Let’s go Trinity! Let’s face the year with the courage of God.

In Him who said, “Fear not, for I am with you”.<sup>10</sup> and “And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age” <sup>11</sup>

"How great a blessing family is to me; whether the family I was born into, or the newer family of youth group that has blessed my life by God's grace! I am so blessed!" - Jim L.

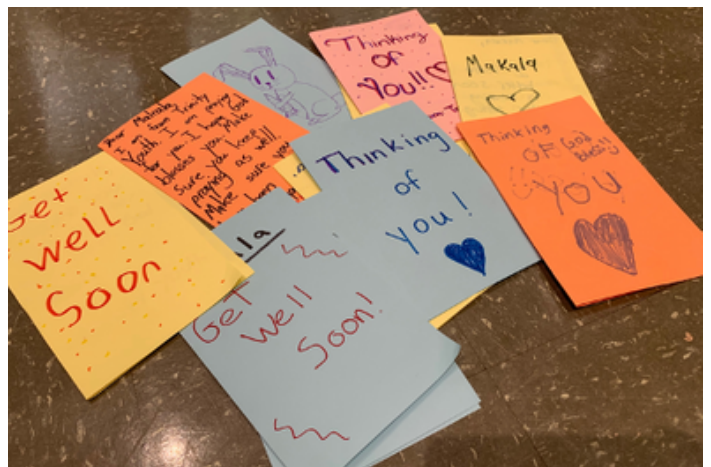

## PRAYER, BIBLE READING, DAILY DEVOTIONS AND FAMILY PRAYER TIMES: SOME TIPS

When you are falling in love, you would give anything to read a love letter from the one you care about. Better still you would love to spend time with that one and just enjoy being with the other. That can be the same in our journey of falling in love with God.

Would you commit to praying and reading your Bible daily? Even if you have done it for years, this is a good time to recommit to the discipline.

Don't miss committing to a specific time to have your quiet time with God daily. Choose a quiet place. Wake up. Be bright and come to meet God eagerly and with a heart of worship.

Read your Bible in a systematic manner. You can read book after book and a good place to start can be the Gospel of Mark. Take time to highlight words in your Bible and write your reflective notes in a journal. Also keep a journal of prayer requests and answered prayers. Four simple questions can help you discover blessings in your Bible reading.

1. Is there a command to obey?
2. Is there a sin I must confess?
3. Is there an example I can follow?
4. Is there a promise I can claim?

Focus on one verse/ word/ thought from your Bible reading for the day. Write it on a piece of paper, card or in your phone so that you can revisit the words every two hours and reflect upon them.

Fast and pray once a week.

Gather with your family if you live with them for a daily time of reading a devotional together and praying together. It is true that "the family that prays together, stays together"

These simple disciplines can add much to your intimacy with Jesus and enjoying your love-relationship with him.

## A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

On December 24th, members of the Youth Choir sang "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing/King of Heaven" by Paul Labloche and Jason Ingram. Based on the traditional hymn tune and text, the composers add a praise chorus with these fervent words of prayer, "King of heaven, come down; King of heaven, come now..." The composers complement the traditional hymn tune and the text and music move quickly, with driving rhythms, constantly pushing us to praise and prayer.

For much of January, I will be out recovering from surgery. Thank you for all of your prayers and support. I will do my best to do my best to continue to serve in whatever ways I can from home. May we always continue to minister and serve in any way possible so that we can touch the lives of others by God's surprising grace. May all feel God's warm embrace!

Something else I’ve learned this year... God provides ~ always ~ even when we don’t recognize HIS provision.
