

From Your Pastor's Heart

My Dear Friend,

Each new day is a gift beyond compare. To live one good day on this planet is an experience to be treasured. When we ponder the tragedy of the loss a million lives in the United States on account of COVID-19, we might whisper, "I deeply feel the pain and great sorrow". In the same breath we might add, "I am grateful to be alive". Oh, the paradoxes of life! On the one hand, we have blessings in abundance, on the other, the burdens of living in a fallen world. Even as recent stories of hatred break our hearts, we think of the dear people of Buffalo, NY and the people of Geneva Presbyterian Church in Orange County, CA. It is hard to hide the frustration, sadness and anger we feel about these inexcusable acts of premeditated violence. It is not fair by any means that hate-driven persons snuff the lives of innocent people. Unfortunately, even as I write this letter, we don't know where the next person is getting ready to pull the trigger. Don't you think this has to stop?

When things like this happen, (apart from all the other implications and ramifications), think about the tragedy of wasted opportunity. Have you pondered lately of how millions of people around the world might be longing for the opportunity to live in the United States? If they were given a life here, all they might try to do is use every opportunity to become better people and make the world a better place. No, not necessarily because they are better people but probably because they have lived in much harsher environments. To them living in a country like America would seem like a slice of heaven on earth. I understand that what we have here is far from perfect, but would you allow your heart to see the comparative blessing? Isn't it therefore a greater tragedy that people who are given such a life with all its privileges end up ruining the prospects of others and even their own? While the illogic of this paradox might be baffling, we turn to the Bible and see that the signs of the times loom across the horizon. When we read what Jesus said about such signs in Matthew 24 or Mark 13, we are reminded to remember that we are called to live in the world but not be of the world (John 17:14-15). One of my favorite texts in the New Testament is found in 1 John 2: 15-17: Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, love for the Father is not in them. For everything in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—comes not from the Father but from the world. The world and its desires pass away, but whoever does the will of God lives forever.

There is a saying in my country which can be loosely translated to state, "One foot on the bank, one foot in the river". Sadly, it appears that Christians too live that way, especially being drawn-in by popular culture and the need to be "acceptable" in the room, in the party and in the crowd. By contrast, the Kingdom is not a negotiable soft toy for our whims. It is the dream-maker, heart-shaper, sinpointer, and mission-inducer that God invites us to. The deal is clear. We are called to live the uncompromised life.

When Jesus died and rose again, he did not try to find new apostles or disciples though many of them had reflected fear and failure. He trusted them to take the message of His Kingdom. He never left them alone. He sent them in the power of the great Holy Spirit and his promises.

In our new series from the book of Acts, we will learn powerful lessons from the experiences of the early church. We will be reminded that we can indeed make an eternal difference! God is at work and he has sent you an invitation, It reads, "Are you on board with me?"

The above quoted hymn is found in The United Methodist Hymnal, #158. It is a great hymn of exhortation and praise. Each stanza begins with a command to 'come,' or 'praise.' The hymn goes farther and directs us to use our whole being, 'heart' and 'voice.' Throughout scripture, and especially in the psalms, we are directed to make music and sing! One fine example is in Psalm 33:

"Sing joyfully to the Lord, you righteous; it is fitting for the upright to praise him. Praise the Lord with the harp; make music to him on the ten-stringed lyre. Sing to him a new song; play skillfully, and shout for joy."

When we gather in worship, we come not with a simple 'hello', but with what the hymnwriter boldly penned in "How Great Thou Art," "...*then I shall bow in humble adoration.*" When we gather, we should find ourselves, as in the majestic hymn, "Now Thank We All Our God," worshiping with "hearts and hands and voices." We come and we praise with full hearted singing and rejoicing!

"How Great Thou Art" goes on to say, "But when I think that God his Son not sparing, sent him to die, I scarce can take it in..." Our wonder, awe, and thankful hearts then should always proclaim, "How Great Thou Art!" Let's approach HIM, God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth, with alleluias and amens!

YOU CAN HELP OUR CHILDREN'S MINISTRY GROW


