During this month we focus on the theme, "Promises in the stillness".




MIDWEEK MUSIC CONCERTS

Sing praise to God who reigns above, the God of all creation, the God of pow'r, the God of love, the God of our salvation; with healing balm my soul He fills, and ev'ry faithless murmur stills: To God all praise and glory! Johann J. Schutz (1640-1690)

Happy **JULY**!

The above referenced hymn is an inspirational, uplifting hymn! It is a favorite of mine to begin a worship service. The tune is sturdy and bold; the words exhort us to sing praise to the omnipotent God of all creation. Also, in this hymn, we find the "blessed assurance" that God has promised to be never far away. He is our "ever present help and stay." As psalm 46 states, "God IS our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble!"

Another uplifting hymn that reminds us to sing joyfully is "Rejoice, Ye Pure In Heart," by Edward H. Plumpte (1821-1891). Written for an annual choir festival in England, May 1865, this text still inspires us today to "rejoice, give thanks, and sing!"

Rejoice, ye pure in heart; rejoice, give thanks and sing; your festal banner wave on high, the cross of Christ your King. Rejoice, rejoice, rejoice give thanks, and sing!

With all the the angel choirs, with all the saints on earth, pour out the strains of joy and bliss, true rapture, noblest mirth! Rejoice, rejoice, rejoice give thanks, and sing!

And singing we have done! On June 12, the Chancel Choir sang "I Love You, Lord," by Laurie Klein, arranged by Jack Schrader. The text references our offering of praise and singing directed to God alone. Following the words of the song, we pray our offerings of music will be pleasing to His ear. This anthem was chosen for the Chancel Choir's last Sunday before Summer break because of this beautiful allusion to singing and praise. This picture is very fitting as we look back on our choir offerings since September of last year. In the June 2022 edition of Tidings, you will find a list of anthems the choir has sung. I list them again because of my heartfelt thanks for everyone's time and commitment to presenting these selections. It is a nice mixture of many styles, moods, and harmonies of choral pieces.

WORSHIP THE LORD IN THE SPLENDOR OF HOLINESS! (PSALM 96:9)

Letter of Mr. Ebenezer Rajakumar (online worshipper)

Briefly introducing myself, I am Ebenezer Rajakumar, a Scientist retired from the Indian Space program and living in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, India.

The Covid-19 pandemic wreaked massive havoc all over the world. I started thinking whether God is angry with us because the authorities shut down our churches also. I was deeply disturbed because I am a regular church goer who never missed a Sunday, even if the weather was not favorable.

In our scriptures, I found an instance where God had clearly expressed his displeasure with the worship offered by his people. Amos 5:21-23 ... your assemblies are a stench to me. ... Away with the noise of your songs! Strong reprimand from our God, isn't it?

God teaches us how we ought to worship him. We did not invent it. When God gave the Commandments to his people at Mount Sinai, he also gave the detailed design of the Tabernacle and set elaborate processes and rules for those selected to serve him in the Tabernacle. Nothing about this worship is to be casual. We worship a holy and awesome God who is also loving and merciful God. We may never allow these basic facts to slip from our mind at any time.

For a worship to be pleasing to God, everyone involved - the congregation, the choir and the pastor must work together as a team. When there is harmony in their collective efforts, the result is a worship service pleasing to God lifting the spirits of every one participating.

During the pandemic I was attending the online service offered by our church in India during Sunday mornings. I wished to spend the evenings by attending an online service offered at an American church when it would be morning there. My search ended quickly, when I realized, Pastor Arun Andrews is with New Cumberland Trinity United Methodist church, Pennsylvania. I knew him already when he was serving in Bengaluru, India. So, it was easy to connect. Now you might say, I am a regular online worshipper at Trinity UMC.

What I love about Trinity UMC - Everything! I can only imagine the many hours Pastor Arun spends in communion with the Lord to be able to deliver beautiful cogent sermons week after week. Classic and contemporary praise songs carefully put together. Tasteful decoration and flowers at the altar. Gifted musicians and singers to lead the congregation in joyful worship. Above all a church conscious of its responsibility to connect with the community through different programs including its support for the needy.

Our churches may be physically separated by geography. But joining Trinity UMC in online worship reminds me of the day in future, when all of us will be united in our worship, seeing our Savior and Lord face to face, and heaven left to our imagination no longer.

Starfish is really on the move lately and doing much work for our "friends on the streets". Today, June 12th, we served 68 people which is higher than average. In addition to handing out clothing, shoes, toiletries, sleeping bags, canned goods and many other items, we have also been providing something "from the kitchen". Over the last several months we've served homemade chicken and rice soup, sloppy joes and hot dogs. The guests love it! It's been a great addition to the ministry.

Grace UMC from Hummelstown happened to notice Starfish on the list of Advance Specials while at Annual Conference and asked if they could help. So on July 10 they will be providing 10 volunteers for us as well as doing a drive for 3 specific items. Here at Trinity Pastor Arun has asked the Youth to participate one month. If you have never done it, please consider coming out as well.

One of our biggest challenges though remains the need for funds and donated items. Our Trinity family continues to bless us with many donations for which we are grateful; however, today we handed out 5 tents with urgent requests for 9 others. I just ordered 11 tents since coming home from the outreach. We may think of tents as camping equipment, but our brothers and sisters depend on them for shelter. They cost us \$25-\$35 each and are easily damaged or stolen.

Please continue to pray for this ministry and especially for those persons living on the streets. The numbers are growing. Following is a list of many items that are greatly needed. Anyone wishing a receipt for these donations can see me and I will provide. ~ Carol Crossley
