

It is an invitation – let earth receive her king. It is personal – let every heart prepare him room. It is celebration – and heaven and nature sing!

As we enter the portals of a brand-new year, here's wishing you the joy of knowing and living for the Lord Jesus in every moment of the coming year. Yes, I am wishing you joy – no matter what! Some years ago, I was having a really hard day. No surprise, even pastors do! Apart from leaning on the Lord and his love, I have enjoyed the gift of music at times like that. Oh! What a great gift Christian music is! I will never cease to be amazed at the gifts of the Lord seen in the brilliance, eloquence and excellence of Christian hymn and song writers. The blending of musical notes with words that bring melody and harmony are a distinguished treat to the senses and a balm to the soul. And then, there is the part in me that listens to music beyond the Christian circle. Smooth jazz, classical, a bit of R&B, pop, rock (not too much – except for those kidney stones) – and yes, country music. I love country music. On a hard day or on a long drive, I can listen to country music and keep going. Talking about hard days, have you been in a day on which you could identify with that funny Charles M. It has been attributed to American songwriter Harlan Howard to have said that "All you need to write a country song is three chords and the truth". Harlan Howard is celebrated for having penned over 4000 songs and was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1973 and into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 1997. One of his statements rings a chord in my heart in a special way. He said, "I take a whole life story and compress it into three minutes."

Stories fascinate me. Maybe that's why I love country music so much. The American poet Muriel Rukeyser is famed to have said that "The universe is made of stories, not of atoms." Would you pause and think about what Harlan Howard and Muriel Rukeyser said? Stories matter. I will add that stories matter because people matter. As we study time and the scriptures, we can become aware that history is really "His story" in which our stories have a place. What a privilege!

We live in a fast-paced world. You can confirm this by simply taking a look around. Fast-food establishments dot the intersection of every highway exit ramp, and maybe even the corner of your town square. Amazon promises two-day delivery... and if that's not fast enough, they can get your package to you the same day you order it. We get frustrated if our phones can't display our emails or social media pages within two seconds of clicking the launch icon. And so it goes on. Sometimes just thinking about the speed of life makes you want it all to stop.

This was the world I lived in all through my college years as I balanced 18 credit hours, two major performing ensembles, and a part-time job nearly every semester – not to mention outside rehearsals, practice for private lessons, and time to eat, sleep, and get together with friends. But I loved the speed of it all, and after graduating in December of 2021, I was ready to dive straight into worship ministry – or so I thought. After nearly a year of searching for a permanent position, I found myself discouraged, worn out, and tired of trying. My vision is to see this ministry take off with excellence and remain so as it grows, attracting both existing church members and newcomers.
