Love boxes: Inviting your participation

We are inviting you to participate in our "Love Box" ministry led by Trinity's Helping Hands under the leadership of Carol Evertts. By God's grace and the faithful work of Carol and Randy Evertts, Tiffany Hollinger and Harry Rodriguez, we have been able to distribute 150 love boxes to families in our community. We have been distributing love boxes every week since the first week of April. We are planning to continue this every other week through September. Carol Evertts is also initiating a partnership with friends from Fishing Creek Salem UMC to share love boxes with homeless families. If you are able to contribute items for a box, here is the list of items.

<u>Food Suggestions for Love Box is as follows</u>:

Medium size cans of fruit, tuna fish and chicken, spaghetti O's or raviolis
Lg. plastic bottles of Juice ex: grape, apple, and orange (no grapefruit please)
Medium size cans of soup ex: chicken noodle, tomato, vegetable
Noodles ex: macaroni, spaghetti, Spaghetti sauces, Parmesan Cheese
Box of crackers ex. Ritz, Townhouse, saltines, etc., Large bag potato chips or pretzels
Peanut butter and Jars of Jelly ex: strawberry, grape
Cookies: medium or 1 large, Boxes of health bars, Large boxes of cereal
