Happy Spring my dear Friend!

Enjoy the creek. Walk through the woods. Listen to that woodpecker. Feel the rustling grass under your feet. Marvel at those birds that fly in effortless formation. Breathe in that fresh smell of Spring. Marvel at the colors of the season. Be lost in wonder, love, and praise.

Let us pray that our rediscovery of the beauty of God's creation will recreate a new heart of worship in us. May we also be led to ask, "How might I reflect that heart of worship every day - at the watercooler, at the sports field, at the drive-through, in the zoom call, at school, at work, when I serve, when some people behave like they want to eat you up and even at the store check-out when the scanner behaves like it has a memory loss".

In a recent Facebook Live prayer time, I asked those attending for responses to the following question: What are some of the things in your life that make you believe that God is good? One of the answers that was repeated was, "grandchildren". I am sure most of you who are grandparents (especially of those cute little ones) would heartily affirm the grandparent's creed, "I believe in grandchildren- even before my children". Kids indeed have a way with life that makes our adult lives more beautiful.

My wife Miriam enjoys teaching a group of preschoolers aged about 4. Not too long ago a student who was new in the class looked in her direction and called out, "Mitts n' Roach". Miriam looked around her and behind her wondering if there was someone with that name that she had not yet met. Not seeing anyone she approached the little fellow who once again called out, "Mitts n' Roach". Miriam asked, "Are you calling me, sweetheart?" He said, "Yes, Mitts n' Roach". She had to work hard at holding back her laughter as she realized that he was trying to say, "Mrs. Andrews". When she came home later that day, Miriam said it was the first time in a lifetime that our last name had come that close to rhyme with "cockroach".

Communication is important. Words are important. In his letter to the scattered people of God, James tells his readers that the tongue can instruct, inflame, or inspire. Like a bit in the mouth of a horse can **instruct**, the tongue can guide, direct or instruct lives (James 3:3). Like a small spark can set a forest ablaze, the tongue can **inflame** and damage lives (James 3: 5-6). Like a tree can give shade to renew a weary traveler, the tongue can **inspire** and renew lives. Proverbs 18:21 says, "The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love it will eat its fruit."

How about using the power of our tongues to share the power of the Gospel? In the month of May, we will embark on a new preaching series titled, "Fearless to live out the Gospel". As we learn from the scriptures about the encouragement, empowerment, and engagement that we are called to, may we find enlightenment that will result in enablement.



REGATHERING CONVERSATION

It has been a true joy to be able to regather in person in our Sanctuary, Mt. Olivet Room, and Fellowship Hall for Sunday worship. We are also grateful that our small groups have begun to meet again in person according to the comfort of each group. Our youth have been meeting in person for a few weeks now. Celebrate from Heart and Spirit and the Sewing Sisters are also making good of the opportunity. We know that the Grandparents in Prayer had met in person in the park before the weather became colder.

I am writing this note to you to address some of the questions, suggestions, and thoughts that I have received. I want to thank each of you who took the effort to directly speak with me or to a leader in the church about your concerns. We take your feedback and opinions seriously.

Question 1: Can we increase seating in Sunday worship?

Answer: Such a decision is made following a few steps. Clearance from the Harrisburg District Office of the Susquehanna Conference, clearance from the chairpersons of the Leadership Team, Worship Team, and Trustees, clearance from the entire Leadership Team. We have valued the guidance we have received from Bishop Jeremiah Park through the pandemic.

With all clearances received, we may ultimately have up to 100 seats open in all in the sanctuary and Mt. Olivet room together. We plan to increase seating from Sunday, April 25. Initially, we will increase the seating to 40 in the sanctuary and 20 in Mt. Olivet Room. This will help us retain our present commitment to social distancing at about 6 feet. We will try this as an experiment for a few weeks and review participation and will also value your suggestions and feedback.

Question 2: Can we do away with pre-registration?

Answer: Maybe sometime in the future, but not soon. We are presently going step-by-step to secure the best well-being of our worshippers. We are also conscious of our volunteer ushers and greeters and how it takes careful planning to organize seating.

Nevertheless, we are able to provide a "no pre-registration required" status for Fellowship Hall. We believe this will especially encourage our youth, to come in there and worship along with their friends. Attendance records will be maintained to help with contact tracing if needed.

Question 3: Why don't we have communion while being seated in the sanctuary?

Answer: This is such a great longing. As your minister celebrating communion, I find it a challenge to not join all of you together in the partaking of the elements in the worship service. The reason we are restricting ourselves is because of the need for everyone to take off their masks to participate. We do not feel that such an act will be one of stewardship and respect for the health of the other.

A spiritually refreshing moment: You could with help of the Holy Spirit experience your communion moment after the church service becoming a very special time with the Lord. You could go back home or to a quiet spot in a park or a lakeside or the woods and reflect upon what Jesus has done for you upon the cross and participate in what can become a very intimate moment with God. Some of us might also enjoy participating with our family members. Could it be possible that a compelled change in how we engage in the sacrament can become an exquisite gift of grace? Christians in persecuted lands who were restricted from any form of public worship will testify of how they found sanctuaries of worship in their prison cells, in-home arrests, and in restricted physical spaces.

Looking forward to Children's Ministry, Sunday School Classes, and Small Groups regathering in person. I want you to know that I understand this season has been difficult for all of us. As your leader, I very much appreciate the graciousness with which you have cooperated and come along with us through the pandemic and the many changes we never anticipated. As your leader, the United Methodist Church empowers me to make decisions. Nevertheless, I believe that the decisions I make must be first taken to the Lord in prayer and then put through a consultative process with the leaders and volunteers that God has gifted us in this beautiful team at Trinity. Sometimes, the process of a decision takes time because of the steps involved. I would request your continued patience if you find that I am slower than you wished I was. I would also very much appreciate it that we would seek to go by the facts that we shared officially through our church services, newsletter, and bulletins and not by hearsay. Finally, it is our Christian privilege and duty to speak in love and to support one another in times like this. Please do not hesitate to speak with me if you have any concerns or questions about these matters. I am truly thankful for the faithful support of our Leadership Team, our Trustees, our Worship Team, and our Regathering Team. Special thanks are due to Shirley Sharpe, Beth Sider, Scott Loomis, and Todd Davis for their role in our conversations. Appreciation is noted for Beth Sider's careful work with many details, Jocelyn MacMinn's work with the website registration options, Anne Matthew's work with confirming weekly registrations. I want to thank all members of our staff who have worked tirelessly and faithfully to support the ongoing ministry at Trinity. Thanks to Harry Rodriguez for his role in the mechanized sanitizing between services.

Most importantly, I unite in gratitude with you – to our Lord who has remained faithful through these dramatically challenging times.

EASTERTIDE

40 Days from Jesus Resurrection to His Ascension where He reveals to us the Power of His Spoken Word

The Road to Emmaus, read Luke 24:25-28, 32.

Jesus opens their eyes to the Scriptures and the Power of His Word that He had been speaking to them since the beginning of His ministry. If Christ, our greatest example, used the spoken Word as His number one weapon when confronted by satan himself, shouldn't we use it regularly?

A teacher from a Christian school sent home to the parents a list of 18 Scriptures to pray over our children. He obviously understands the power of God's Word. Here are a few of the verses:

- "Hate evil, you who love the Lord" (Psalm 97:10).
- "If sinners entice you, do not consent . . . do not walk in the way with them. Keep your feet from their path" (Proverbs 1:10, 15).
- "Submit therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you" (James 4:7).

Praying and declaring verses like these is the highest and most effective level of prayer. I know of parents who have diligently spoken God's Word over unsaved children (in prayer, not in their hearing), using verses such as the following:

- "God . . . grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth . . . that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will" (2 Timothy 2:25-26 NIV).
- "And all they children shall be taught of the Lord; and great shall be the peace of thy children" (Isaiah 54:13 KJV).

After these parents boldly and diligently declared what the Scriptures state, in time the deceptions and bondages holding the children were broken, and they were saved. Others have done this over marriages, finances, and other areas of life. They simply found Scriptures pertaining to their circumstances and declared them over their situations.

The Hebrew word asah translated "create" in the Genesis story of God creating the world, also means "to accomplish, do, or perform." It is used in the following verses, in which the context is speaking God's Word:

- "So shall My word be which goes forth from My mouth; it shall not return to Me empty, without accomplishing [asah] what I desire, and without succeeding in the matter for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11).
- "Then the Lord said to me, 'You have seen well, for I am watching over My word to perform [asah] it" (Jeremiah 1:12).

God's Word does. God's Word accomplishes. God's Word performs. In each reference, humans spoke the creative, doing, accomplishing, and performing words God used! First John 5:14-15 tells us: "And this is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him."

We must find out what the Scriptures teach about our situations, then make our biblical confessions and declarations accordingly. We are then saying the same thing He says, which honors Him and gives Holy Spirit a decree He can truly empower – a biblical declaration. This is a powerful facet of intercession.

Pray with me:

Father, You are not human that You should lie. What You have said You will do. Your words do not return to You void, they accomplish everything You intend them to accomplish. I pray that this revelation goes deep into our hearts and becomes living truth to us. May we become more diligent to speak Your words in every situation and over our daily lives. In Jesus Name

The core of this teaching is taken from Dutch Sheet's book "Essential Guide to Prayer" Bethany House 2001. (Use these scriptures daily as you pray over your children, grandchildren and. Your un-saved children and friends.)
