From Your Pastor's Heart My dear Calvary-bound friend,

A couple of days ago I was privileged to be at a table with two remarkable veterans. One had served in WW II and the other had served in the Korean war. During our conversation one of them spoke of the mystery of surviving war. He talked of a question that has troubled him over a lifetime, "Why did some of my comrades never make it, and why did I?"

It can be especially difficult to process a question like that when you think of spouses, children and loved ones who were awaiting the return of those fallen heroes. Our conversation around that table lingered in my mind.

As we approach another season of Lent and Easter, I think of another question: Why me, Lord?

To reflect a little more about that question, let me share something that has been a deep and intense blessing to my soul. Over the years since I was a teenager, it has been my practice to travel with Jesus down the Via Dolorosa – the path that he traversed that first Good Friday from Jerusalem to Calvary. In my quiet times of prayer, I have consciously walked the path that Jesus took as I meditated upon the texts of the Gospels. I have heard the mocking of the soldiers, the sighing of the crowd, the lament of the women and the sweet voice of the Savior. The One who was beaten, humiliated, spat upon, ridiculed, nailed to a crude wooden cross radiates a love that is truly amazing. Over time my journey to Calvary has been made all the more precious as I have sung and reflected upon the words of hymns like 'Alas and did my Savior bleed', 'When I survey the wondrous cross', 'Were you there when they crucified my Lord?', 'Jesus, keep me near the cross', 'On a hill far away' and 'the old Rugged cross'.

The words of Elizabeth Cecilia Clephane in the hymn "Beneath the cross of Jesus" best describe my feelings at times like that:

Upon the cross of Jesus, Mine eye at times can see, The very dying form of One, Who suffered there for me: And from my stricken heart with tears, Two wonders I confess, The wonders of redeeming love, And my unworthiness.

Why some people don't experience this love, and why I do... is a mystery of grace that is baffling and propels me to a lifetime of gratitude.

I pray you will be truly blessed in your journey to Calvary during this Lenten season beginning Ash Wednesday (March 2). I want to invite you to consider embracing this season as a time for deeper intimacy with Christ, for deepening relationships and for serving the community and the world. To help you practically take steps towards those goals, I have shared some Lenten disciplines that you might want to follow. Be blessed my friend!

INVITATION TO CONSIDER PRACTICING LENTEN DISCIPLINES LIKE:

- Including an extra 10-15 mins for prayer each evening.
- Including an extra daily Bible reading time focusing on the Gospel narratives leading to the cross. Ask questions like these to the Bible text: What does this tell me about human nature? What does this tell me about God's character? How can I follow the lesson that Jesus teaches me here?
- Setting aside a dollar or more a day to support homeless people in the Harrisburg Area through Starfish Ministries, families battling cancer through Vickie's Angel Foundation, helping families in our school district through the ASK project or any other ministry that the Lord lays on your heart.
- Setting aside one item from your possessions either daily or weekly through the season and give them away to those who may benefit from them
- Praying for the members of Trinity using the Church telephone directory. If you pray for 5 individuals/families daily through the 40 days of Lent, you will pray for 200 individuals/ families.
- Praying for one nation a day by using the prayer highlights at: https://operationworld.org/prayer- resources/countries-alphabetically/
- Spending quiet moments alone with the Lord. Write down a list of your spiritual, moral and social sins. Seek the Lord's forgiveness. Erase or blot out each of those sins from the list once you have repented and confessed them. Be free.
- Writing that card, note, letter, text, e-mail or make that call to someone you needed to reconcile with or to seek forgiveness from. Or communicate just to encourage someone.
- Using the days of the week to guide us in prayer especially at 8.30 pm:

Monday (M): Pray for mothers who are single moms

Tuesday (T): Pray for teenagers who face difficulties, loneliness and temptations

Wednesday (W): Pray for world concerns and governments

Thursday (T): Pray for the transmission of the Gospel through media, print, music, etc.

Friday (F): Pray for Families that are going through hard times

Saturday (S): Pray for Church **services**. Pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit's work of transformation and empowerment.

Sunday (S): Take time to be in silence. Think of your week gone by and thank God.

Look ahead to the new week and commit yourself to be his witness in all you do.



ORGAN RESTORATION



In the upcoming months, the organ restoration work will soon begin! Currently, many issues plague the instrument. These issues continue to have a deteriorating effect on the instrument, so much so that only one of the keyboards seen in the picture is usable. This restoration work, by the Peragallo Organ Company of Paterson, NJ, will breathe new life into the instrument! Pipes, large and small, will be removed, repaired, and revoiced. Other work to be completed includes repairing crushed wind lines, worn leather, and non-functioning parts. Somewhat disappointing is that this work is not 'seen' because the instrument is located behind the walls. Access to the organ chambers is in the sacristy and the hallway leading to the sanctuary from the youth room.

The organ, unlike any other instrument, is capable of so much, including leading worship, accompanying others, and presenting its own unique repertoire. As mentioned previously, there will be a time, during the restoration process, when the organ is unusable. Yet, when it comes back to life, we will praise the Lord with the grandeur of its remarkable palate of sounds!

CHOIR

Last month, the Chancel Choir sang an arrangement of "Standing on the Promises" by Stan Pethel. We had quite a good time singing it, with it's relaxed and rhythmic feel! Following in the theme of "Standing on the Promises," set forth by Pastor Arun, we take time in rehearsals to ponder the promises found in the anthem texts.

On February 6 and February 27, the choir sang "How Firm a Foundation," arranged by John Carter. A formidable promise we find in this hymn anthem comes from Isaiah 41:10, "Fear not, I am with thee, O be not dismayed, for I am your God, and will still give you aid." This is a favorite hymn of mine.

As we continue rehearsals, we will continue to look at the anthem texts on a deeper level. It is our hope to understand and convey the message through the music we present.
