# From Your Pastor's Heart

My Dear Friend,

I hope you have had a blessed experience of journeying with our Crucified and Risen Savior through the Holy Week and Easter. For many across the nations, Lent becomes a season of intentional devotion focused on the cross, fasting, prayer, sacrificial giving and serving. I know of believers in my homeland who go on a liquid diet for 40 days starting Ash Wednesday. I also know of churches who spend from 9 am to 3 pm in prayer, scripture, liturgy, singing and fasting every Good Friday. In certain Eastern Church traditions much of those six hours in the services are experienced while standing. Closer here in Pennsylvania, not too long ago, one of our daughter's schoolteachers was seeking to help her students identify in a small way with Jesus' experience on the cross. To do so, she asked them to spread their arms wide open and hold them in that position for 15 minutes. Nehara said it was an eye opener.

I hope each of us will carry something deep and precious from the 2022 Lenten, Passion Week and Easter lessons for a longer part of our faith walk. I am always baffled by the death-defying love of our Lord who did it all to save an unworthy soul like me. May I suggest a little spiritual exercise? Would you be willing to create a half hour silent time of solitude, reflection, and meditation – simply focusing upon the death and Resurrection of Jesus? As you spend that time, would you focus on Galatians 2:20 and ask," Do I know the meaning of being crucified with Christ? Do those who interact with me see Christ in me? What changes must I seek to embrace as one crucified with Christ?"

On another note, we were delighted to see each of you who were able to return to worship in-person after the pandemic. We are truly grateful for seeing you again and give the Lord our thanks for keeping you safe in the palm of his hands. In this pastoral letter I hope to capture some life-moments from our congregational experiences. They celebrate the gift of being the people of God.

In April of 2022 we had a sweet song from the sweet nineties. Betty Hannum and Doris Bair proved that age is no bar to sing in a quintet along with Eloise, Miriam and Nehara (with Todd accompanying). Their rendition of 'T'is so sweet to trust in Jesus' came with perfect pitch, crystal notes and happy smiles as a song from the heart. Apart from the big applause, you just got nominated for the Trinity Grammy awards, dear Betty and Doris. To live life with zeal and zest like our seniors do is nothing short of inspiring. Mary Weller (92) was welcoming people to church at our 8.15 am service on Sunday March 27th. She was called home to be with the Lord the next day. I wouldn't be surprised if she is volunteering in the welcome department at the Pearly gates! I can imagine Nevin Bashore (94) ushering and wondering how he can send some of those offerings from up there to Trinity in New Cumberland! I smile at the thought that on the Sunday on which I inadvertently wore two different socks to church, even jack Baumbach didn't spot my folly. Jack (99) plays this 'game' with me in jest at the church door sometimes. He acts like he is accidentally going to step on my shoeless toes! Oh! The gift of our amazing seniors!

This has certainly been a season of mixed emotions for us as a church. We had experienced great joys in worship but have also felt the hand of pain on the other. We remember the families of Mary Weller, Carl Weltmer, Nevin Bashore and Barbara Fisher. The family of Lynn Coleman celebrated his life the day before Easter and the family of Richard Carlson are preparing to celebrate his memory. To me as your pastor every faithful member who goes home to be with the Lord spells one less faithful witness, prayer supporter and volunteer.

Three scriptures come to mind as I think of the witness of our senior friends :

The righteous will flourish like a palm tree, they will grow like a cedar of Lebanon; planted in the house of the Lord, they will flourish in the courts of our God. They will still bear fruit in old age, they will stay fresh and green, proclaiming, "The Lord is upright; he is my Rock, and there is no wickedness in him." Psalm 92: 12-15

Even to your old age and gray hairs I am he, I am he who will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you; I will sustain you and I will rescue you. Isaiah 46:4

Since my youth, God, you have taught me, and to this day I declare your marvelous deeds. Even when I am old and gray, do not forsake me, my God, till I declare your power to the next generation, your mighty acts to all who are to come. Psalm 71: 17-18

Now for a word from the world of our youth. Every year Mary Strausbaugh who is our lay servant at Trinity prepares care packages with snacks, goodies, gifts, a letter/note/card from the pastor and a church member or two. Mary mails these packages to our youth who are in college. I have seen Mary do this faithfully over the years in which I have served at Trinity. (Thanks Mary) It is done to let them know that we remember them, pray for them, and think of them as their church family. In Mary's words, they are simple things meant to bring some joy on campus. We don't usually hear back from our busy students, but this year Brady and Connor Kiehl, Kaleigh Weist, Amanda Varner, and Noah Ryall made it a point to express their gratitude. We were genuinely touched!

Every Sunday our youth gather twice – once for the Sunday School hour at 9.30 am and then at 6 pm for our regular youth session. I have enjoyed joining them each Sunday at both sessions. Does that explain why I am "almost late" sometimes to the 10.45 am services while being present in the church building? The Bible study series, prayer times, fun times and interactions have been a real joy. You can read more about the sessions and our teachers in the note about youth ministry in this issue of Tidings. Our group of youth are faithful and diligent in learning God's Word and ways. Our times around the Scriptures in the last year have been about an hour in the mornings and over an hour in the evenings. Some of our youth have invited a couple of friends who have started coming regularly. I see the promise of deeper things in what the Lord is doing in our youth ministry.

Early in the pandemic, the Lord laid it on my heart to start a Facebook Live prayer time on Tuesday nights. That ministry of prayer has yielded hours and hours of cumulative prayer and brought a faithful group of praying friends together. Some time ago, I had invited Pastor Peggy to lead the prayer times – especially at a time when she was feeling like she was unable to do much for the ministry. I know the assignment brought her great joy and she was truly faithful in preparing and leading us in prayer. After Pastor Peggy passed on, it has been a matter of gratitude that Beth Sider and Genevieve Lupold have joined me in leading the prayer times. I cannot say enough thanks to all of you who join us faithfully to pray. These days we have anywhere between 15-22 individuals joining us each week. What a blessing! If you have never joined us, why not join us and experience the blessing of praying for others in this small group?

We are excited that our children's ministry has been steadily growing in faith, witness, and strength. Recently Jean Ruth who has completed her cancer treatment and rejoices for the gift of being cancer free, told me that she was deeply moved to see all the children who led us in worship on Palm Sunday. Jean Ruth said, "Since Palm Sunday, I have gone back to the video of the service to watch the children again and again. If I am feeling in need of some encouragement, I just turn on that video!" Praise the Lord for every parent, grandparent and elder who is supporting their children/ grandchildren to be present at our "Kids for Christ" ministry every Sunday at 9.30 a.m. We are grateful that from about eight kids who were attending a few months ago we now have over 20 when everyone comes. Praise the Lord!

A group of 53 individuals registered to participate in our mid-week Bible series, "You'll get through it" by Max Lucado. It turned out to be a real treat of Christian fellowship around a meal and God's Word. It was like being at an oasis after how the pandemic had robbed us of our gatherings. The nursery has been a true blessing to families with little ones. Oh! What a joy it is to see them join us for the Children's talks each week!! Special thanks to Sandy Williams and Joyce Klinger and all who volunteer to serve.

As I was writing this letter, I received a call from a doctor friend residing in a Southwestern State – a former worshipper at the first church we served in India. She had requested me to record a video message for Easter that she had planned to share at a supper she hosted for friends on Easter night. She was excited. Her friends, some of whom were not Christians received the message with open hearts. It thrilled my heart to know that what we recorded at the media studio at Trinity during a very challenging time of ministry and ministry preparations was blessed by the Lord to carry the Gospel.

A lot is happening. We are grateful.

I keep dreaming of the day in which our ministry will draw many more who do not know the love of our Savior. It doesn't take too much – just a people who believe that they have a Great Commission to obey, a Great Story to tell and a Great promise to live by (If you haven't heard those points before, why not watch the Easter Sunday 10.45 am service online?)

Now if you thought I missed something important, I sure know I could have! There is a lot more going on than what this letter captures. Did I hear that enchanting melody from an 8-hand piano rendition? A great dedication and coming together of musical gifts and talents has been witnessed in our music ministry under Todd Davis' leadership. It has been heartening to see how music brings us together in worship as we do it all for the glory of God. A special thanks to those of you who encourage Todd by your participation in our Mid-week Facebook Live Music times. (We pray for Todd's good and speedy healing and recovery from surgery). We do not forget all who have served faithfully in the United Bells (Thanks Wilma for your leadership) and in the Chancel Choir through difficult times. We are grateful for our worship team under the leadership of Beth Sider, for our ushers, greeters, altar guild and worship leaders. Did we ever imagine that sister Barbara as our lay leader could invite, inspire, and encourage so many to serve as worship leaders! Wilma has faithfully included our children to serve as acolytes, and they sure have! What an amazing ministry of a team! And we can go on thanking the Lord for our volunteers who serve to make the leadership (Shirley Sharpe and team), Pray and Go ministry (Sharon Sheffer and team), the Love Box ministry (Carol Evertts and team), Starfish ministries (Carol Crossley and team), the ASK project (Cathy Baum and team), Downtown Daily Bread (Carol Crossley and team), the Sewing group, Stichin' Sisters (Kathy Karnes and team) and others, a blessing. We are looking forward to serve our community on community day with teams led by Carol Evertts, Mike Kirkham and Jim Uber, Cathy and Tom Baum, Dianne and Mike Schofield, Mickey Minnich, and Carol Crossley.

On May 4th and 5th, we will be engaged in a prayer chain, Pray and Go into the community and a prayer vigil at the Trinity steps on Bridge Street. Don't miss being part of the fuel behind the fire of God's work at Trinity and in our community. Let's make the National Day of prayer a time of commitment to mountain-moving, life-altering, community-transforming prayer.
