VICKIE'S ANGEL WALK -WALKING FOR HEALING AND HOPE

On October 9, 2021 people gathered at the New Cumberland Borough Park to express their solidarity with families challenged by cancer. Vicky's Angel Foundation brought together donors, walkers and most importantly witnesses from among those battling cancer. Faith, hope, love: the bedrock upon which the foundation is established. Mickey Minnich, Founder of the Foundation, reminded walkers that dollars contributed go directly towards the support of individuals and families in need and not towards administrative costs.

Mickey's long-term hope and dream is that they could raise a sum of \$5 million that could continue to generate incomes to help support families.

That was a solemn moment when the names of those who had passed on during the year from among the people who were helped by the foundation was read. Our hearts were moved when we got testimonies from cancer survivors and were introduced to the little twins who have cancer.

HOW IS IT WITH YOUR SOUL? DO YOU BELIEVE? REALLY BELIEVE?

Two Christmas' ago, Nihal Andrews helped me find a large TV for my prayer room. I was led by the Spirit of God to use this screen for in home bible study such as ALPHA and any other studies that used You-tube or ZOOM. I have had several occasions when I have had a group in; however, I have found another use is the beautiful Christian piano music that I can play all day long. This turns my home: (God's Dwelling Place) into a haven of peace and serenity. Along with the background music is the Word of God that is on the screen. A particular scripture remains on the screen for 5 to 6 minutes; plenty of time to meditate on the scripture and memorize it; and apply it to my life. I often leave the room and come back to a new scripture that catches my eye and heart and I can only linger with that verse.

If you have a computer and have access to our on-line worship, you have access to all the You-tubes. If you scroll down the right side of your screen, you will see a large variety of You-tubes, many of them Christian music for meditation. Just choose one of them and worship the Lord in your home or wherever you may be.

The one I'm listening and worshipping with right now is Dappy T Keys, "3 Hours of Prayer Time Music/Alone with God". Here are some of the scriptures that I have been blessed with this morning:

Matthew 19:26 – But Jesus looked at them and said to them "With men this is impossible but with God all things are possible"

Mark 9:23 – Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes."

Luke 18:27 – But He (Jesus) said, "The things which are impossible with men are possible with God."

Jeremiah 32:27 – Behold I am the Lord, the God of all flesh. Is here anything too hard for Me?

Luke 1:45 – "Blessed is she (Mary) (or YOU) who believed, for there will be a fulfillment of those things which were told to her (Mary) (YOU) from the Lord."

Hebrews 4:16 – Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

1 John 5:14 – Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to HIS will, He hears us.

When I asked in my title of today's message, "How is it with your soul?" That is the question that John Wesley asked of his small groups and is still used today by many small groups. When we come together for study and fellowship, we want to be attentive to our brothers and sister's souls and how we might pray for them. "Iron sharpens iron; so, a man/woman sharpens the countenance of His/her friend." Proverbs 27:17

These scriptures from the Word of God makes me ask myself. Do I really believe the truth of God's Word for me and for all people? 
THE PRAISE CORNER by Todd Davis, Director of Music Ministries

CAITLIN'S SMILES

The mission is simple, the impact immense. Goals:

- To give children with life-threatening or chronic conditions a way to express their creativity.
- · To make hospital stays and treatments less stressful for children and their families by providing them with engaging arts and crafts activities.
- · To work with medical staff to provide stimulating activities for their pediatric patients that are safe, beneficial, and appropriate.
- To give volunteers meaningful, enjoyable, ability-appropriate, and necessary tasks that contribute to the mission.

Bags of Smiles are given to children in the hospital. Each bag is decorated by a volunteer (often small children) and filled with treasures, such as: play-doh, hand decorated journals and cards (decorated by a volunteer), crayons, craft kits, and a ton of love sprinkled in by the loving hands of the volunteers! These Bags of Smiles help the children cope with their time in the hospital. Individual arts and crafts kits (coping kits) are also sent to hospital departments and clinics where children wait for lengthy treatments. These kits help the child focus on a fun activity as they go through their treatments. Each kit contains all the supplies and instructions needed to complete the craft. Volunteers ensure that all the supplies are included in individual sandwich baggies and sealed tightly for delivery.

Volunteers are the lifeblood of Caitlin's Smiles.

With only a handful of staff, they depend on volunteers in many ways. They have hundreds of volunteers doing a variety of tasks, allowing Catlin's Smiles to reach children in over 100 locations in eight states and the District of Columbia. Without volunteers, Caitlin's Smiles would not exist. So... what can we do as a congregation?

Prior to COVID, dedicated volunteers (all ages) from our congregation (and their friends and family) would meet at the church 6 times per year to decorate bags, make cards, and prepare craft kits. We are considering starting this ministry up again, but before we do, we would like to better understand the interest level from our congregation.
