### DISCERNING TRINITY'S WAY FORWARD AMIDST THE UMC'S PRESENT JOURNEY

On September 21st, the leadership team met with, Rev. James Copulos, pastor of Mt. Calvary UMC, Harrisburg. During the meeting Rev. Copulos shared responses to questions from the team about various concerns related to our denomination and to our congregation in the light of disaffiliations. After the meeting, the team committed to pray seeking the Lord's guidance until its regular meeting scheduled for September 26th. On September 26th, the team voted to request a representative of the Susquehanna Conference to meet with Trinity's leadership team to help us understand the disaffiliation process.

What would be our next steps? On October 26th, the leadership team will meet with Rev. Kathleen Kind, Director of Connectional ministries of the Susquehanna Conference, who is representing the Conference in sharing about the process with local churches. After the meeting on October 26th, we will work towards sharing information with the congregation. In the process, we plan to gather as a beloved community to pray, talk and seek the will of the Lord for our future steps as a congregation. Decisions about the future of Trinity will not be made by the leadership team, but by members of the congregation. We are committed to keeping this process loving, transparent and fair. Please do not hesitate to ask questions or share your thoughts with us.

## **UPCOMING:** Christmas Musicale

Is it too early to start thinking about Christmas? Probably not! From the big stores to the grocery stores, I see signs of it everywhere. Yet, Christmas, and Christ in Christmas, should always live in our hearts. It is not merely a yearly event to be celebrated. It is a life-long walk with Christ, filled with faith and hope, that leads to eternal life!

Yes, once again, we will host the annual Christmas Musicale on Thursday, December 15th, 7:00 pm, and Sunday, December 18th at 10:45 am. The "Lessons and Carols" theme offers a wide range of hymnody, readings, and involvement! We'll hear choirs, organists, soloists, various instrumentalists, and more. Would you like to take part? Please let me know!

On Wednesday, December 7th, at 12:15 pm, I will present an organ concert at Camp Hill Presbyterian Church as part of its Music and Arts Series. I invite you to attend. My program will include music for Advent and Christmas.

## **ORGAN SHOWCASE**

On Sunday mornings, I have begun to use the organ quite extensively again. The restoration has brought nice tonal colors and sounds back to the instrument. Many of these sounds are in the quieter pipes. It is an art, the art of 'registration,' that is selecting the pipes to use for each piece, to make the organ and music sound alive!

The organ is divided into three keyboards, each with its unique set of 'stops,' the pipes for a particular imitative sound or purely organ sound. While these division sounds can be coupled together to produce a large sound, each 'division,' or keyboard, has its unique quality that stands alone. I have found this now to be the case.

Second, the 'string' sounds and now the individual imitative flute sounds really come to life. The flute sounds from one division can be accompanied by the string sounds of another division, giving an orchestral feel to the organ. There are pieces I like to play by Mozart, his Church Sonatas, that are transcribed for organ, that solely use the string sounds, that very convincingly produce a string orchestra effect.

Third, the overall clarity of the instrument, with just the right amount of brightness and harmonics, helps lead the hymn-singing in a remarkable way. It also provides for a rich, clear sound for the big, bombastic pieces!

The organ has many capabilities, too many to write about in a brief article. In future newsletters, I will continue to write about the instrument and all that it can do!

## **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD**

Once again, we are partnering with Operation Christmas child as a part of Samaritan's Purse. This year we are incorporating a hybrid model where you can pack a shoe box or contribute. If you contribute, please make your check to Trinity UMC Church and in the memo line indicate Operation Christmas Child. If you wish to pack a shoe box, you may use one of your choosing or pack one that is provided on the display table. If you wish to wrap your shoe box, please make sure that the lid and the box are wrapped separately. There is a \$10 shipping and processing fee that should be put in an envelope and put in the shoe box. On the display table, you will also find a flyer to indicate the gender and the age of the child that you choose. This should be affixed to the lid of the shoe box. There are further guidelines if you wish to go on to Operation Christmas Child that will explain what to pack and not to pack as well as a brochure on the display board that will give you this information.

This program delights children from more than one hundred countries where local partners deliver the boxes along with a message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For some children, it is the first time that they have received a gift and some go on to participate in the follow up discipleship program, the Greatest Journey.

Please put your shoe box on the table next to the display and have them in no later than November 20th. Delivery will be made on November 21st.
