Dear Friend.

While people all over the world might see paintings, photographs and videos of the beauty of Fall in Pennsylvania, it is our privilege to actually enjoy these precious gifts. May we never be too busy to notice God changing the colors in his garden.

On another note, we are experiencing unusually challenging times. We are a nation troubled by the coronavirus, pained by racial tensions, buffeted by hurricanes, ravaged by wildfires and unsure of our political tailwinds. As we move closer to the 2020 Presidential elections, we find ourselves in the throes of an embittered battle of words and wills. Not too long ago I heard a friend say, "I don't want to talk politics anymore. It is not possible to share my views without offending even my best friend."

Prayers like - Lord, enough of the disrespect, the hurting, the false accusations, the discrimination and the prejudice.

It is said that in the heat of the American Civil War, one of President Lincoln's advisors said he was grateful that God was on the side of the Union. Lincoln replied, "Sir, my concern is not whether God is on our side; my greatest concern is to be on God's side, for God is always right."

Is that not a concern worth considering and pursuing?

When our daughter heard that my new preaching series is to be titled, "Election 2020 and leadership – Jesus style", she asked, "Dad, are you serious? Are you hoping to keep your job after that series?"

Dr. Ravi Zacharias said something like this, "In today's environment, it is not always what we say but also what we do not say that matters".

May I ask if you would be generous to pray for wisdom to your preacher? My goal is not to lean on either sides of the political spectrum but to remind us of the standards for leadership that Jesus set. As someone said, "The leader's job is to keep the main thing, the main thing". I will be trying to do just that with God's help in this preaching series.

And if I lose my job after that, I might be forced to join the media!

### REGATHERING IN THE SANCTUARY COMING SOON!

What can be sweeter than the fellowship of believers? During 2020 the fellowship has taken on a new look. Our minds are stretched to think in new ways.

Thank you for those who have replied on the In-person Worship Survey. This helps in terms of how many are able and wish to sit together.

Prior to each service in the sanctuary, those who wish to attend will need to make a reservation. Each week if you wish to attend, you will need to make a reservation either on online or a call- in-reservation (for those without the internet). The reservation will be open from Monday thru Friday on a first comefirst serve basis.

The seating will be in the Sanctuary, Fellowship Hall, and Mt. Olivet Room. The September 8, 2020 communication from Bishop Park includes this information: Unless the PA Department of Health recommends otherwise for all indoor gatherings, continue to limit room occupancy to 25 people, ensure 6 feet social distancing space between each person, require masks, provide hand-washing/sanitizing stations, and disinfect rooms where people gather.

The in-person service will be at 9:30 a.m., however, we will also live-stream the service so you can participate from your home during the exact time at which the service is taking place in the sanctuary. It will be available for you to begin watching at 9:30 but will also be available online so you can participate later whenever you desire.

We are targeting an October start date for in-person worship, if the COVID19 numbers stay down. Watch your weekly bulletin for the upcoming in-person worship date to be announced. Contact Beth Sider, Chair of Worship Team, to know more or if you have any questions or concerns.

# SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS Pray for America

## CROP HUNGER WALK 2020 - COVID-19 STYLE

This year's annual CROP Walk will be quite different due to the effects of the CoronaVirus. Because of ongoing Covid-19 concerns the Harrisburg CROP Walk will be virtual. But one thing hasn't changed. People are still going to bed hungry, even starving, and children are still not receiving the proper nutrients to grow and develop into healthy adults. Now more than ever, they need your help.

Trinity has been a CROP Walk participant since at least 1980 (I know because that was my first walk!). But did you know that many consider the CROP Hunger Walk the "granddaddy" of all charity walks. The first recorded walk was held on October 17th, 1969 in Bismarck, ND. One thousand people participated, and they raised \$25,000 to help stop hunger! Several other CROP Hunger Walks occurred soon after and before long communities around the country were organizing these walks to aid in ending hunger both at home and around the world. Today, well over 2,000 communities across the country join in more that 1,600 CROP Walks sponsored by Church World Service each year. This year marks the 49th year of the Harrisburg CROP Walk!

There are many ways you can help with this year's CROP Walk – pray for the walk, make a donation, or even join me in walking as part of your gift. Because our walk will be virtual, we will be walking on our own. Missi St. Cyr and I are planning to walk on October 18th at the New Cumberland Borough Park at 1:00, and we would love company if you would like to join us. If you would like to make a donation, you can send your check made out to CWS/CROP to the church or place it in the collection basket found at church on the 11th or 18th. Together we can make a difference! Thank you so much for your support and generosity, as always.
