

From Your Pastor's Heart

My dear Trinity Family,

"Growing older is not fun", is a line that I have heard ever so often. Someone said, "You know you are growing older when the rocking chair feels like a roller coaster".

When it comes to aging, it is very possible that we would earnestly wish that our loved ones could stay young forever. On the other hand, you may remember the joke that I shared with you in a recent sermon. A fellow told his friend, "My wife is an angel". His friend replied, "You are fortunate. Mine is still alive!". When I was little, it seems I told my parents that I wanted to become a doctor. When they asked me, "Why?". I said I wanted to discover a medicine that would keep them alive forever.

As I write this letter my heart goes out to those of you in our congregation who are battling growing physical limitations, challenges of intense medical conditions or are serving as caregivers. As you might have observed, we have a long list of names in our weekly prayer request section in our Sunday bulletins.

People matter. Prayer matters. You matter.

From time to time, I whisper to my body, "Thanks for being my friend for these 55 years." When I turned 55 last year, I experienced a kind of graduation. I graduated to becoming an object of attention for organizations like the AARP, cemetery plot sellers and telemarketers who wanted to sell anti-balding shampoo (No, I'm kidding). The good thing is that I can now indulge in the senior's menu in some restaurants and appeal to the "aging factor" if I forget something! Closer home, I realized that I am entering a season of life where the hair on my face might ultimately exceed the hair on my head!

While we watch the challenges of aging "creep up on us", where can we draw strength from? In Isaiah 46: 4, our Lord declares, "Even to your old age and gray hair I am he, I am he who will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you; I will sustain you and I will rescue you." That is a great verse to have on your refrigerator door, your cell phone's home screen, computer's screen saver, your journal – and in your memory!

The promise is very precious. In it, God is claiming his rightful place in our lives as our Creator (I have made you), our Sustainer (I am he who will sustain you...I will carry you), our Redeemer (I will rescue you). In one of Chris Tomlin's songs, we hear these words,

I know who goes before me I know who stands behind The God of angel armies Is always by my side

The one who reigns forever He is a friend of mine The God of angel armies Is always by my side*

What a great assurance! He is the One who created us, sustains us, and redeems us. The hymn writer Robert Grant expressed adoration by speaking of God as our Maker, Defender, Redeemer and Friend (O worship the King all glorious above).

The month of September 2021 is a season of change and transition for us at Trinity. Our new nursery for kids has brought us a season of transition. Our youth ministry is in transition. Our communications and office secretarial spaces are in transition. Our adult Bible class getting back into in-person sessions speaks of transition. Pastor Carl, Sister Barbara and I being able to restart our weekly pastoral visits spells transition. I guess having continental breakfast at our Rally Day was a kind of transition too! (Great job, Cathy and Tom Baum and team). Not to forget our welcoming music at the Genesis Room by Fred and Diane, Bruce Snyder and Todd Davis and yes, the return of our Chancel Choir! Transition. Transition. Our mask policy too went into transition!

Through all the changes, we are given glimpses of God's faithfulness and people's sincere faith. In a recent home visit, we were welcomed by a woman whom Parish Nurse Barbara Zimmerman describes as "the lady with the most surgeries done to her joints and bones in our congregation". The "bionic woman" if you might call her so! Through my years of interaction with this woman I have not heard words of complaint or dissatisfaction. On the other hand, she is always writing encouraging notes and speaking words of hope. A true believer and witness for Christ. What touched my heart deeply during our visit was how she described her love of God's Word and of how she dials Trinity's 'sermon by phone' number and keeps her note pad handy to write down God's truths. At the top end of her walker, she has the 'sermon by phone' number 717-774-0108 pasted on a piece of paper with a tape. Some time ago her daughter told me that she had listened to one week's sermon 6 times over the telephone. Thanks for your faithful witness Elaine Ocamb!

To me, that piece of paper with the tape on Elaine's walker feels like a five-pointed terrazzo and brass star on the 'Holy-wood boulevard of faith'.

PRAYING THE SCRIPTURES: PSALM 91

Let's make the scriptures personal. God's Word was written specifically for us. His desire is for us to pray His Word back to Him from our hearts believing that He will ful-fill what He has promised. Take Psalm 91 for incidence, when I pray Psalm 91 back to Him, it would look like this:

Peggy dwells in the shelter of the Most High, and abides under the shadow of the Almighty. **Peggy** says of the LORD, My refuge and my fortress: my God; in whom I trust! For it is God who delivers **Peggy** from the snare of the trapper and from the deadly pestilence (fatal, infectious disease). God will cover me with His pinions and under His wings **Peggy** may seek refuge".

I encourage you to make Psalm 91 and all the Psalms personal, meditating and praying them by changing the pronouns. We know that God watches over His Word to perform it. Praying Psalm 91 in a personal way makes it even more intimate and effective. It provides a powerful new point of view. The more you pray it the more God's Word gets deposited into your spirit. Then when you need it the most it will flow out of you.

Here is Psalm 91 for you to insert you own name and pronouns into the Psalm. You can tear this page out and place it in your bible and pray it daily in these times of great tribulation:


