

Which way?

My dear Church Family,

The parsonage garden has been a welcome spot for kids from the neighborhood. As they pass the front portion they stop to look at and even talk to the ceramic rabbit, pigs, deer, and that Amish crafted bird garden spinner. One mom told us that her little fellow "fell in love" with one of our piggies. She told us of how he would insist on bringing his toy pig and would leave it with our pig in the garden. He would then continue walking towards the cul-de-sac ahead not forgetting to return to our garden to take his pig back home. I wonder if that little fellow could one day become the President of a great 'Cheer the people' club or a home bound ministry program. The neat thing is that his little heart understood that everyone needs someone. I hope and pray that during this difficult and challenging denominational season, we will know without a doubt that we have each other to love, uphold, uplift, and belong to – no matter what might lie ahead.

"Pastor, my friends told me that their Methodist Church has been discussing disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church, can you tell us which way Trinity will be going?". This question or a variation of it has been coming to me lately and I am taking the liberty to say....

- Let us continue to be fervent and faithful in prayer
- Let us continue to love each other and everyone (no matter how different someone might be) with the sweet love of Jesus
- Let us be patient to hear the facts and details as the leadership team will share them
- Let us make decisions keeping the call of Jesus in mind, "But seek FIRST his Kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well". Matthew 6:33

This is by no means an easy time for us as a denomination, pastors, or congregations. I remember the story of a young aspirant who was applying to join the police department. In a written test he was required to answer a question relating to a hypothetical situation. The question stated, "You are on duty as an officer and become a first responder on the scene of an accident. When you get close to the car that violated a stop sign and caused the accident, you realize that the lady driver was obviously driving under the influence of alcohol. As you are assessing the situation you also become aware that the driver is the wife of the police chief. What would you do?". The young applicant thought for a moment and wrote, "I would mingle with the crowd and disappear".

We might be tempted at times to do the same. Some of my pastor friends have told me that they are truly grateful that they are retired and don't have to be in leadership during these rather turbulent times. Some other pastor friends of mine are on the cusp of retirement and are appreciative of the gift of finishing currently. What is it that we are navigating through as a denomination? We may wind our way through many and various explanations but putting it simply, here is what we are experiencing. On the one hand there is a movement hoping to see the United Methodist Church open the doors for the solemnizing of LGBTQ weddings and the ordination of LGBTQ persons into pastoral ministry. On the other hand, there is a movement of disaffiliations of local churches from the United Methodist Church of congregations that are opting to not go that way.

Where do we stand? Which way are we going? What will the future of our loving community of faith at Trinity look like?

On my part and that of our leadership team, we are committed to understanding the situation and sharing information transparently and fairly with you as a congregation. As I am writing this letter, we are preparing to meet on September 21st as leaders to pray and receive information from a Pastor from our Conference who is well versed with the ongoings of our denominational journey. Let me assure you that as we go along, you will have the opportunity to share your thoughts and questions as members of Trinity. When we come to a moment at which we will have to decide about which way Trinity could go, you will have a voice and a vote as members.

May I request you to kindly continue to be in a true spirit of prayer, love, and trust. The Lord will lead us. He will not fail us. We can trust Him. He has more work for us to do - to touch lives with his amazing love, power, truth, healing, and most of all with the message of the old rugged cross and the empty tomb.

By the way, let's not forget that lesson from our little pig-loving friend; Everyone needs someone - especially at times like these.

150TH ANNIVERSARY HISTORY COMMITTEE PRELIMINARY REPORT

The 150th Anniversary Committee of Trinity United Methodist Church met on September 1, 2022 at Trinity Church. The persons were in attendance: Mary Herr, Beth Sider, Jan Ocamb, Carol Wilson, Pastor Arun, and Pastor Rod. The committee is planning that the 150th Anniversary will be celebrated in 2023 with the following articles, worship services, articles and displays:

- A 150th Anniversary Dinner held in November that celebrates the dedication of Trinity's first building. (The actual dedication of the first building occurred on November 23, 1873)
- A display table in the Mt. Olivet Room that displays pictures and articles, and artifacts from the four periods in the life of Trinity Church (beginning with the Mt. Olivet Church). This display would be changed quarterly.
- Four special Sundays during the course of 2023 that would highlight aspects of Trinity's life and ministry and mission. These areas would include music and worship, mission and outreach, Christian education, and arts and architecture contained in the church that reflects the Christian faith of the community.
- An article in each monthly edition of the Trinity Tidings that discusses some aspect of the history and ministry of Trinity Church.
- The creation of a video about the history, mission and identity of Trinity Church that can be used in worship or in group sessions.
- The inclusion of former Trinity pastors as well as the ministerial sons and daughters of Trinity Church in worship services in various capacities such as preaching, worship leading and ministerial reflections.

The members of the 150th Anniversary History Committee realize that is an ambitious agenda. We do not know how much of this agenda can be implemented, or even if the items presented represent what the majority of the active membership of Trinity Church want; therefore, the 150th Committee is seeking feedback from all who read this article in the Trinity Tidings.

Please let 150th History Committee know which of the proposal we are suggesting are appropriate and can be done and which ones are not. The 150th History Committee cannot implement these proposals ourselves, we are going to need the active and enthusiastic involvement and participation of the membership of Trinity Church, and especially of the committees in our congregation who work in the areas of mission, education, music, worship, fellowship and youth. Please do not hesitate to work wholeheartedly with the 150th History Committee when we ask for your assistance and the utilization of the congregation's resources that you superintend.

Finally, please consider becoming a member of the 150th Anniversary C. We are meeting again on Tuesday, September 20, 2022 at 11:30 am in the St. John's Room at Trinity. We are planning to meet monthly at Trinity Church to continue the planning process.

Trinity Church has been helping to serve lunch at Downtown Daily Bread, a 7-day soup kitchen in Harrisburg, for many years. In previous years, DDB received funding by "billing" churches \$2 for each meal they helped to serve. DDB has discontinued that practice and now relies on voluntary donations for their funding. All donations that Trinity has received to help pay for the meals we serve have been forwarded to DDB.

Here is a look at some of the accomplishments of DDB in 2021:

Thanks to the support of our donors, 1,000 individuals who were hungry, homeless, or at risk of being homeless, received assistance at Downtown Daily Bread in 2021.

• The Soup Kitchen fed 26,064 people for breakfast and lunch meals.

• Our Day Shelter registered 11,719 visits


- The Night Shelter opened a month earlier than in past years; we were open every night from November 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022 (151 nights). There was a total of 4,913 bed nights, and the nightly average attendance was 33 people.
- Partner organizations expanded their use of the Day Shelter to offer valuable services. UPMC initiated a weekly medical clinic led by a doctor and nurse.
- In Client Assistance, we provided 4,348 showers, 600 laundry debit cards (\$10 value), 3,000 bus passes (\$3 value), and 120 photo ID vouchers (\$31.50 value).

Here is how their needs have grown so far in 2022:

"With the high temperatures and humidity this summer, more clients have been coming in for showers and our air-conditioned shelter. The daily shower list has jumped from an average of 30 people to 50. Visits to the Day Shelter have increased too. At the end of August, we had registered 12,290 visits in 2022, surpassing last year's 12-month total of 11,719! The Soup Kitchen has also seen attendance jump by 16%. Support of donors like you make it possible for us to server everyone who comes through our doors!"

Trinity will continue to support the valuable ministry at DDB by helping to serve meals, which is coordinated by Carol Crossley. You can still make donations to support DDB financially thru Trinity, but you can also send them directly to DDB if you choose











Youth Ministry

Our little group of youth are faithfully gathering to fellowship, pray, study God's word and also have moments of fun together. We are especially thankful for our adult leaders, Janice Snyder and Rylee Fisher, who join Pastor Arun weekly. We are thankful that we could complete our morning Bible study series from the Gospel of John, hosted by Dr. Tony Evans. Following that series, we are presently studying Psalm 23, lead by Pastor Matt Chandler of the Village Church in Texas. The youth are relating very well to Bible study sessions led by the following individuals: Sue Grubb, Rylee Fisher, Barbara Hawk, Genevieve Lupold, Mel Eyer and Pastor Arun. In our evening series, we are embarking on studies on friendship.

CARE PACKAGES FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS

It is special when you are remembered while being away from home. The college care-pack ministry, coordinated by Mary Strausbaugh, has brought a welcome smile on many a college student from our Trinity church circle. Once again, Mary Strausbaugh is inviting you to share the name and address of college students from your family circle that could benefit from receiving a care-pack from Trinity.
