



Is life meaningful?

My dear Trinity Family,

Greetings from the Eastern Indian State of West Bengal. I am writing to you from the place that the French novelist Dominique Lapierre called, "the City of Joy" in his 1985 novel. Kolkata, as it is now called, was formerly known as the city of Calcutta. The State of West Bengal of which Kolkata is the capital, played a prominent role in India's journey under British rule. "Calcutta" was the capital of British India from 1756 to 1911. The State of West Bengal is also famed for being host to the Indian Government's first mint (established in 1757), the land of the Hoogly River, the Himalayas, the Bengal tiger, delectable Bengali sweets, unique artistry, craftsmanship, intellect, and theater. The city of Kolkata will also be esteemed forever as the place where a saree-clad nun of Albanian origin changed the meaning of how Christ's compassion touches people in need. Her birth name being, Anjezë Gonxhe Bojaxhiu; she is better known as Mother Theresa.

As we travelled once again from the West to the East, we were gifted with what I would like to call "an anthology of faces." The word "anthology" in its dictionary meaning refers to a published collection of poems or pieces of writing. As we beheld face after face in check-in lines, security checks, in-flight experiences, immigration counters, customs clearances, on busy streets, in malls, in homes and in churches; it felt like I was being given the opportunity to listen to poem after poem. Poems that spelt stories. Stories that spelt longings. Longings that spelt questing.

The writer of the Biblical book of Ecclesiastes has a one-liner that in my reckoning is an award clincher. You may ponder what that line might be. As you read the text and listen to him eloquently build his commentary about human efforts, human aspirations, and human frustrations, he factors in a buzzing build-up of sorts. Like a chant resonating in the cockles of the heart. The refrain repeats, "Everything is meaningless." Those three words could have been the headline for breaking news moments like when the twin towers came down, when Hiroshima happened, when Hitler dehumanized innocent Jews, when a Hollywood star committed suicide, when COVID took away millions of lives and when your efforts of a lifetime came crashing down with a medical report. The list can be long.

As human beings we at times feel trapped in our predicament. We know so much in this scientific age and yet appear to be like ones sifting through dirt in a gold rush only to find that, "everything is meaningless". We are humbled to find ourselves before a great and mighty wall that keeps us away from "the promised land". And what do we do to scale that wall? Our culture engages in self-help quests, new age explorations, religious pilgrimages and even 'happy atheism'. How do you think we are faring amid our seeking? Don't our stories on social media, the local news and the neighborhood tell us that Solomon may not have been off the mark? Isn't it tragic that even amid unimaginable wealth, fame and success, our world of social media is abuzz with songs, texts and posts that translate the agony of discovering that for many, everything seems meaningless.

Writing from the Eastern side of travel, I take the liberty to share a warning. Western friends with weak hearts must be prepared to experience cardiac discombobulation or elevated blood pressure at the least – not while bungee jumping or para-diving but while navigating city traffic! On a more serious note, we have been through days on which we have seen significant wealth, flourishing mega and technology-driven cities – and yes, probably the wildest traffic on this side of the Atlantic. In contrast, we have also beheld the face of abject poverty, low-income housing, messy weather-beaten streets, and the faces of hungry children seeking bread. Where might one find promise? In the city of Kolkata, I have seen the smiles of poverty-stricken children, heard the zeal for rescuing innocent lives in the voice of an anti-human trafficking social worker, and witnessed a local church host music and English learning centers for people in the community – most of whom are not Christian. As I find myself placed in the confluence of pain and promise, I recall the words of Mother Theresa, "Not all of us can do great things, but we can do small things with great love."

I ask myself, "What can I do? What can I do better? What can I do to serve Jesus and people in a more meaningful way?"

I started writing this letter to you in the city of Kolkata where the Lord blessed us with a truly wonderful time with my parents, my brother Pastor Ashok and my niece Rahel.



It is the morning of August 13th, 2022. I am concluding the writing of this letter from the South Indian city of Trivandrum where we are visiting with Miriam's mother. At 7.30 am yesterday we attended a service at Christ Church in the heart of the city. After hearing an encouraging sermon from the Pastor, we shared in the Lord's Table at the very altar at which we had knelt to receive Communion with Miriam's dad (Appa) in years gone by. Then came the moment of reckoning which I had anticipated with trepidation. We walked to Appa's graveside. As we did, we were moving from our memories of an online funeral in December of 2021 to facing our moment of grief and pain in a personal fashion. Miriam's dad was a faithful disciple of the Lord, a remarkable human being, a veteran of the Indian army, a loving husband, dad, grandfather and great grandfather, a joyful testament to his Savior's love, even after losing vision in both eyes. He was a lover of theater and music and had directed some precious musicals and stage productions. On many an evening in the past, the home would be filled with the music of the accordion and his lovely voice singing praises to His Savior. As we stood at the graveside, there were tears and deep mourning. As I held Miriam, she whispered, "Would you please pray?". I swallowed hard and prayed. Pain gave way to promise. When I said, "Amen", I was touched to hear Miriam singing.....

When the trumpet of the Lord shall sound and time shall be no more, And the morning breaks, eternal, bright and fair; When the saved of earth shall gather over on the other shore, And the roll is called up yonder, I'll be there.

It was one of her dad's favorites.

At that graveside, I took a deep breath and rested in the assurance that unlike elsewhere, life is always meaningful because of Jesus.
