We realize in all things about our lives, that some things change and some things don't. When it comes to the weather, we are so glad that things will soon be changing! A warm welcome to you our dear friend, Spring! (With the brightness and warmth, you bring, I wonder if you hold an Indian passport)

The season of Lent brought us many a challenge to reconsider what needs to remain and what needs to be removed. The Easter narrative reminds us that Christ has indeed conquered, death, sin, Satan and the powers of darkness. For anyone who sincerely takes a journey to the cross and the empty tomb, it is impossible to not want to start life all over again. No wonder the scripture declares in 1 Corinthians 15: 57, "But thanks be to God! He gives us **the victory** through our Lord Jesus Christ".

In our new series in April, I want to embrace the challenge of celebrating "Victory Over". I want to invite to you journey with me as we look at biblical narratives and texts that remind us that (Continued on page 2)

we cannot and must not live like people who have "one foot in the river and one foot on the bank" (An Indian saying oft used to challenge compromise of truth and value). *When it comes to consecrating our lives, there are not mid-places in some places.* I have often reiterated that happiness without holiness cannot be reality in the Christian circle. Some of us might say, "but I am made in a certain fashion and that's why I lose my temper, gossip a bit, speak a 'few' untruths or I'm a work-shirker occasionally". Friend, you must wake up from that delusion! *God did not make you that way.* He made you for abundant, victorious living. *Jesus did not leave his heaven to let you remain the way you are.* He came down, so that you might go up. Up in your attitudes, up in your victory over the flesh, up in your victory over worldliness, and up in your victory over the self. The Christian life is not one we live on a playfield as much as on a battlefield. The devil wants to defeat us with disunity, self-obsession, an inward focus, the refusal of grace and much more. The lord wants us by contrast to live in liberty, joy and peace.

Let me close this letter with the challenge presented in one of my favorite texts in the New Testament. Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5: 17, "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: the old has gone, the new is here! ". When I was in my early teens I enjoyed every day of life like a little child fascinated by a new-found joy. One of the most memorable truths during that fascinated me and convinced me that God was not dead, that God was not a fictional add-on in a life of false hopes – was the fact that I could see the difference He was making in me! Even me! What a joy to see that I could find victory over the very things that had potential to make me a little less like Jesus. A little more frustrated maybe, a little angrier maybe, a little more selfish maybe, a little more wealth-obsessed maybe. Victory over all that and more were available to me and I look back and borrow John Newton's words to sing, "Amazing grace, how sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me". I guess as we grow older, the Lord does overtime to keep us on track - A twhatever stage of life you are in, I pray that you will find your, "Victory Over" season this April. As Spring delights, you with bright skyscapes and beautiful sunshine, the earth below will breathe with new life as flowers bloom and creatures rejoice. May your heart rise with new hope and promise that, "Christ is risen. He is risen indeed".

# Reflections on Creation April 2017

"Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything; tell God your needs, and don't forget to thank him for his answers. If you do this, you will experience God's peace, which is far more wonderful than the human mind can understand. His peace will keep your thoughts and your hearts quiet and at rest as you trust in Christ Jesus." ~ Philippians 4:6-7 (The Living Bible)

It seems like a dream now that I was dressed in shorts and riding my bicycle on three occasions in the aberrant month of February. Now, as I write this, with 22" of snow on the ground and howling winds blowing more around, I could get a bit anxious. We are scheduled to go on a family vacation to Florida later this week. My mind can do all sorts of crazy things with the 'what ifs?' that now line up for my attention as I am trying to manage all the last-minute items that were already on my list. Snow makes everything more difficult to navigate, and every chore becomes a larger obstacle on my path towards our departure. As I struggle to shovel a path from the house to the bird feeders and another to the chicken coop and another to give the dog access to a place to do her business, I feel overwhelmed. I am thankful that my husband is doing the big job of clearing the driveway and our vehicles. My body is achy and tired. My mind is wired. My chores are mired. Help!

Coming inside for a break, I am drawn to movement in the holly tree just outside the picture window. I sit on the wide window bench to see which birds are enjoying the bright red berries on this wintry day. I watch as Titmice and Robins and Bluebirds flit through the tree, dislodging clumps of snow as they reach for berries. I'm thankful that we didn't cut those berries off when we considered trimming the tree in the fall. The warmth of the wood stove and my exhaustion prompt me to take a minute to just sit.... and my gaze falls on the larger scene outside.... Tall dark tree trunks flanked with white, a curving driveway, freshly cleared, and the peaceful quiet and beauty of snow gently fall-ing through the woods all around me. I surrender to the magical feeling of it... like being inside a snow-globe held in God's hands. Nothing else about the day has changed, but I've allowed God's peace to fill my heart and replace the turmoil. I've taken my eyes off the immediate task and looked up.

I remember being anxious about the rainy days we had while in California, but our daughter-in-law has shared pictures of the magnificence and abundance of the flowers currently exploding into bloom in the desert. Places we visited that seemed arid and lifeless are now simply carpeted with gorgeous blossoms! It's a sensational display that hasn't been seen for decades. The rain and snow that falls does not fail to do the job it was sent to do, just like God's Word does not return empty. It is restorative to surrender that need to be in control and relax, knowing that God is. There is redemption to be found in any situation that makes me uncomfortable. Patience and trust and prayer are the keys to discovering that redemption. "Turn your eyes upon Jesus..."



Good Father, thank you for showing me once again how to lay down my cares and anxieties and trust in you for the plan. Help me to dwell less on my comfort and more on your great power. Amen.
