From the Pastor's Desk

My dear Trinity Family,

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus Christ, friend of the lonely and healer of our broken world!

In a world of many "Why?" questions, we will spend this month pondering the statement, "Why the cross can heal a broken heart and world".

Before I proceed to share my message in this letter, I wish to share some updates and express gratitude for what God is doing among us. Whenever I include specific Trinity-related details/ events/plans, I am particularly thinking of our friends who, by virtue of either health, age or location, are unable to join us at our worship services/ programs. We very much appreciate the faithful prayers and support of each of them. I have been deeply touched to note that such friends read the Tidings from the first page to the last faithfully – and also remember us in their prayers. What a blessing!

Music with a message: We give God thanks for the amazing time that Dan Stokes and our Chancel Choir shared at the Bethesda Mission in Harrisburg on January 23, 2018. It was a time when God's love was shared with those present in a powerful manner. The music was fantastic – and our team's personal touch in conversations with those in attendance was precious. Our youngest member Cecil Leppo represented the Boys Scouts of America and Trinity in his uniform and with cheer. 

tra 5-minute prayer time into your day, fasting and praying once a week (even if it means skipping one meal). **Talking about fasting, have you lately considered fasting from your electronic gadgets, from selfishness, from pride or from anything that you may know hinders your time with God or your devotion to Him?** I am aware that there are those among us who are committed to abstaining from expenses on favorite foods, activities, etc. and saving dollars for a community cause (like the Heifer project, Bishop's partners in Mission, etc.) Some of us men may want to forfeit some Saturday morning sleep and join Eric Rodgers and our team in setting breakfasts for the Lenten Prayer breakfasts and studies. Did I hear some of the women say, "Go for it, gentlemen!" Would some of you want to set aside some hours each week to serve at Downtown Daily Bread or New Hope Ministries or any other mission that cares for people in need?

As we enter this holy season, I also want to share a **special invitation** with all of you. Can we make this a committed **season of prayer**? I want to invite EVERYONE at Trinity to join us in our daily 8.30 PM stop and pray times (Take five to pray). I want to invite you to use the following acronym-based method to pray. I first created this method for the church in India and we were truly blessed as we prayed using this method. It is indeed exciting to not only pray but to see evidences of God's power, miracles and transforming touch in lives around us and even far away.

In preparation for this method of prayer, you may like to think ahead and make lists of the names of people, world concerns, governments, ministries engaged in sharing the Gospel, families in need, churches, pastors, ministry teams, etc. that may fit into the list presented above. You can also always include the names of people in our prayer chain or from our pulpit announcements/ parish nurse's bulletins. Most of all I invite you to pray for the transformation of lives, for the Gospel to touch those who have never heard it or heeded it. Let us pray for a great revival that will bring hope and healing from above.

Maundy Thursday, March 29, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. Jesus' words to his disciples were accompanied by his washing of the disciples' feet. As we gather to partake of this Last Supper, we do so remembering his commandment to love one another and his demonstration of love and servanthood. Indeed, Jesus commands us to do likewise. The word commandment has its root in the Latin, *mandatum*. hence, Maundy Thursday. In our 7:00 p.m. service Pastor Andrews will continue his series, "Why Calvary? Because Christ Redefines Servanthood" Musical leadership will be provided by Chancel Choir, Sing and Celebrate, Jane Gable, soloist, and Cathy Kirkham, flute.

Good Friday, March 30 at 7:30 p.m. Our journey with Jesus continues as we walk with him through his trial, the taunts of the crowd, his crucifixion and death. Pastor Andrews' message "Why Calvary? Because Christ Understands Our Pain" will prepare us for moments of reflection guided by the Chancel Choir, Trinity Youth Singers, the Joyful Noise Trio, Ron Winter and Amy Rynex. Nathaniel Hollinger will take us to the very foot of the Cross through the intense crescendo of the tympani.

In order to provide reasonable security for our worshippers, we will follow the procedure used on Christmas Eve. NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER


THURSDAY, MAY 3, 2018

TALL , FAT and FUNKY -shaped mugs WON'T fit on the rack.



SPOTLIGHT ON MISSIONS: TRINITY'S SEWING GROUP




One of Trinity's longest running mission ministries is the Sewing Group. The primary project of this group is to produce handmade quilts. These are given annually to Bethesda Mission for men and women, Paxton Street Ministries, United Methodist Home for Children and New Life for Girls. Group members also knit and crochet lap robes. These are distributed to Claremont Village, Manor Care and Golden Living. Cloth lap robes are also made. These are given to Country Meadows' Alzheimer's Unit. The group meets the first and third Thursdays of every month from 10 AM to 2 PM except during the summer.

Members also work on these projects at their homes. Many hands enhance this ministry! We have welcomed donations of equipment, full skeins of yarn, washable cotton fabric, embroidery floss for knotting quilts and of course monetary donations. If you are interested in being part of this ministry, please contact the Trinity Church office.

Reflections on Creation
March 2018

"One of them, when he saw that he was healed, came back to Jesus, shouting, 'Praise God!.' He fell to the ground at Jesus's feet, thanking him for what he'd done. " ~Luke 17:15-16

Having recently had cataract surgery on my left eye, I feel like I have been granted a wonderful perspective on gratitude. For years I struggled with fuzzy, distorted vision in both eyes. I tried different contact lenses, glasses with graduated lenses, eye drops, etc. Nothing was giving me the visual clarity that I wanted. I especially noticed the problem when I was trying to identify a bird and, even with binoculars, could not make out the details of stripes, eye-rings, streaking or wing bars which are so frequently the markers between one bird and another. After the surgery, I could see things which I have not been able to see without magnification for years! The decorative stitching on the border of a rug, the deep furrows on the bark of backyard trees, the words on all the signs along the highway... It was making me a little giddy! Now, here is where the gratitude comes in. I know that once I have the other eye done, I will quickly get used to the improved distance vision. But at this time, I am in the lucky position of having a constant reminder of one unsatisfactory eye. All I have to do is close my left eye and remind myself of how things were... Now, imagine a situation where one part of your stomach was nourished and sated but another part was growling and empty. One hand was warm inside a heavy glove and the other was bare and cold from pushing all your belongings around the streets in a cart... One half of your brain was calm and at peace because you've always enjoyed safety and security, and the other half was in a constant state of anxiety because nothing has ever come easily to you. Being reminded daily of a need makes you much more likely to be grateful when it is met. We so easily take our blessings for granted. We grumble and complain about the most petty things when, to some others, our lives must look like fairytales. I pray that even after I have equal acuity in both eyes, I will never forget to look to God in sincere gratitude for the abundance of ways in which I have been shown mercy.

Lord, give me your eyes to see those whom I can help. Give me your heart to extend your love to the world. Thank you for vision, for the spectacular things that my eyes have seen! Amen. ~Jady Conroy


