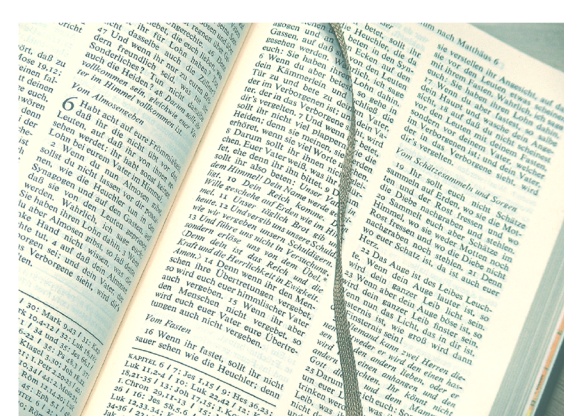

Speaking of faith for the future, it was my privilege to teach and share moments with our confirmands in the confirmation series. What a blessing to interact with these young lives full of potential, dreams and possibilities—most of all, faith in the Lord Jesus. God bless you Linnea, Kaity, Dacey, Nehara, Ethan, Owen, Zach, Eric, Kurt and Noah. It was a true joy to join them, their families and loved ones as they affirmed their faith as professing members of the body of Christ, the United Methodist Church and of Trinity.

As I write this letter we also look forward to a special time at our Homebound picnic and Sunnier side of sixty service on June 26. We are especially delighted that our youth will be sharing their gifts and graces at the service and Haley Warner, our director of youth ministries will share from God's word. Our prayers for Barbara Zimmerman, Mary Herr, Beth Sider and team who are working behind the scenes for the event and service. The day is promising to be a special intergenerational experience of fellowship, fun and worship. On another note, by the time this letter reaches you, some of our senior youth and adult volunteers would have made their mark in South Carolina by engaging in the mission trip. Thank you!

As we reflect upon the Lord's mercies upon us, we also pause to thank him for the privilege of renovating a level of the old parsonage. It has indeed turned out to be an absolutely beautiful space that we can be used by multiple groups and also for our emerging ministries. We thank God who made this project possible through the bequest we received from the estate of LaDonna Winter. I want to join Janice Ocamb and our leadership team to thank John Mickle who took the lead on behalf of our Trustees in the project. Gratitude is also well mentioned for our Trustee Chair, Scott Loomis for his leadership to our team of dedicated Trustees. We are grateful for the meticulous job done by George Estep and his team from Madison Homes in the execution of the project. By God's grace, the "Winter Room" promises to be a heart-warming space where we can meet with one another in the presence of our Lord. As you notice, a lot has happened in a short span of time.

Our youth are blessed to have our newly appointed director of youth ministries, Haley Warner serve them. We believe this appointment will usher a new and fresh season of revival and transformation in the lives of our young people and in the lives they will touch by their witness. We are grateful that our Children's ministry has been actively supported and served by our intern Alexis Kiehl. We are also anticipating an increase of our creative arts in ministry and worship with Rebekah Lando joining us as our intern as well. In the first week of Haley being at office, some of our youth arrived to paint wall hangings for her room. Our office has not been so youth-filled in a working day before! With our team's average age going down significantly, I am wondering if I must wear a wig or shave the white in my beard. Be sure, that none of that will help!

I want to encourage you to continue to pray for our children and youth. Let us continue to love them, care for them, invest in them and show them the love of the Lord Jesus in a way that they can best understand. I wish to remind you of the words of Rev. Dr. Stephen Gallahar, "youth ministry is

not a sprint, it is a marathon.” I guess that under-standing can be extended into our children’s ministry too. Thanks to each of you who devote of your time and energy to provide Biblical lessons, music, crafts, snacks, safe sanctuary support and your good Christian witness among young lives at Trinity.

Those of you who attended the church retreat last year will recall that I had presented the dream of improving our youth and children’s ministry spaces. I am grateful that the leadership team has continued to discuss and pray about the matter. At the moment we are in conversation about our youth room and how we can make it a special space for our youth and the friends they invite. We are grateful for the spirit of cooperation and team-work that we experience as a leadership team and Trustees. We are de-lighted to welcome Dave Leppo (newly elected Trustee) and Jed Beshore (newly elected Lay delegate to Annual Conference) on board. Kindly continue to pray for our teams and feel free to share your feedback or questions with us. We are always “better together” as Bishop Jeremiah Park reminds us in the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church.

With regard to our efforts to connect with community, I believe our VBS and SIS are two of the most effective means that we have engaged in over many years. At this point we are grateful that we can also move forward with other dreams like setting up a Community Soup Fellowship, using our parking lot and street-side spaces in a festive and happy way to celebrate National Night Out (Aug 7). Dan our music man has set the street-side alive with “the sound of music” from time to time! Thank you, Dan, our music man, and all our music people! In each of these efforts may we seek to be good stewards of our mission of “making disciples of Jesus Christ for the trans-formation of the world.” We are also panning towards our annual church retreat for 2018. **Kindly save the date: Saturday, August 25.**

As you read this letter, Miriam, Nehara and I would have retraced our paths to India. About 30 hours of travel from door-to-door will all be more than worth the while when we are met with an embrace and a welcome by our parents, loved ones and friends. We will spend our time in India in three cities – Bangalore, Trivandrum and Kolkata. We look forward to being back with you on the 25th of July. We will miss you when we are gone!

I am grateful to Pastor Carl who will help us anchor our worship services during the month on the 8th , 15th and 22nd. I am also grateful to Rev. Raymond Brooks and Rev. I am sure you will be blessed as you receive the ministry of God’s word through his servants Rev. David C. McCullough, Rev. Carl Ford Peterson, Rev. Mike Minnix and respected Bishop Jeremiah J. Park. As we journey along, I would like to invite you to consider the call of the Scriptures. 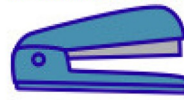

# Youth Update! July 2018

## "Follow and Go"

These are the two commands Jesus calls of His followers at both the beginning (Matthew 4:19) and end (Matthew 28:19-20) of his earthly ministry. With the shared leadership of Michelle Loomis, Missi St. Cyr, and myself our youth focused on these two commands and put them into practice throughout the week of VBS as they attended sessions, went out into the community, assisted the children, and even ate s'mores around a campfire in the youth room (disclaimer: we microwaved the marshmallows and no real fire was used in the making). The youth considered what it might mean to experience true adventure, acceptance, joy, rest, and peace on the river that cannot be found in this world.

## Highlight: Our "Prayer Rocks!" Prayer Walk

On Tuesday night, the youth adventured into the streets of New Cumberland with the prayer rocks they had painted Monday evening (courtesy of the Loomis backyard); each one a bright color with a scripture verse. Led by the nudging of the Holy Spirit, the youth stopped at different landmarks, businesses, and homes to place a rock and pray over the location. Owen Rynex was one of the youth on the walk, and led the group over to a home where he asked two women if the group could pray for them. The group even prayed over an injured kitty cat, whom they named Zacchaeus after a VBS lesson. It was such a powerful evening and the VBS youth leaders and myself could not be prouder of the youth for their boldness and willing hearts!
