under our ministry over the years. We have known some of them since they were little. They will now come with their families and children and celebrate God's goodness with us! Thank you, Lord!

Thank you for praying for us during this time. What a privilege to connect in prayer at 8.30 pm EST across the time zones. We delight in what our Lord has been doing amongst you while we are away. We thank him for the blessings received and shared in our worship services and at Summer in the Sonshine. We will miss being there but pray for the ministry partnership between the young people from First United Methodist Church, Lubbock Texas and our youth - also the Choir's anticipated participation in the visit to Bethesda Mission.

We are grateful for the progress in health granted to those among you who have had special needs – especially Lisa Leen, Norma King, Patricia Roh and Marjorie Creamer. We will miss Edwina Newmeyer and Lois Rudy who were called home to be with our Lord while we were away. Precious lives that will be remembered with gratitude.

As we look forward to our journey together as a congregation in August 2018, I wish to encourage you to:

Attend our Church Retreat with the theme, "Maximizing Life" on Saturday, 25 August. We invite you to be
present at Camp Hill United Methodist Church. It will be a great time to laugh together, hear each other,
pray together and be challenged together. A time for all ages. We have an excellent guest speaker, great
location and a team led by Shirley Sharpe coordinating the event.

I am sure you are excited about these opportunities and especially about the possibility of reaching out to our community in New Cumberland.

On this side of the world, returning to India has gifted us with precious memories. Nostalgia. Reconnections. Memories of moments in which God touched us in special ways - from the time Miriam and I accepted the Lord Jesus as our personal Savior in the city of Chennai, India. Miriam was 11 years old and I was 8. And oh! The many orchestrations of God in our ordinary lives. This visit has also taken us back to how God called us to ministry in the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church. We have been reminded of how we moved from "reluctance to obedience" and of how we were eventually




led to serving alongside all of you in our Trinity Family. We borrow the words of the Psalmist in Psalm 40: 5 to capture the essence of our emotions, "Many, O LORD my God, are the wonders you have done. The things you planned for us no one can recount to you; were I to speak and tell of them, they would be too many to declare."

As I am writing to you, France is celebrating it's FIFA World Cup victory – and the story of how immigrants have made an incredible difference to a country. India has been in the spotlight for violence against women. US President Donald Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin are set to meet in Helsinki.

There is something remarkable about an elevated view. It softens rigid borders, diminishes differences and helps us view life from "higher ground."

Writing this letter from about 8000 miles away does not feel strange. It just reminds us that the whole earth is the Lord's! It also reminds us to pray for and work alongside people across borders. As our plane took off from the US on June 25th, we could see a progression. Buildings, roads, landscapes moved further and further away. Along with it the demarcations disappeared. From 33,000 feet, we could no longer see private properties, but we could see cities. We could not see sailors on a deck, we could see ships like white dots on the blue sea. We could not identify political party lines, we could identify human habitats.



As darkness fell upon the earth and we closed our window shades, we were brought back into focus in a different way. We found ourselves surrounded by people in a common journey with us; people of different ethnicities, world-views and experiences. At that point, we had one thing in common. We had all trusted an airline to safely transport us across the Atlantic. We had all received in-flight hospitality and those of us in the economy cabin were craving a reasonable night's sleep with cramped feet and limited recliner comforts. But the bottom-line was that in every passing minute the pilot, crew and that Boeing 747 were maximizing travel time. Just imagine if the pilot said in mid-air, "Time to relax, crew! Let's shut engines down and have some down time!". Down time it sure would be! Here we come, gravity! The point about any journey is that it requires a destination, a path and a perseverance towards the goal. As we think of "Maximizing Life" at Trinity, we must keep our eyes on the goal.

These are people we love, respect and are more than grateful for. The visit to India becomes more precious for Nehara and me as we are visiting with them after a period of two years. My mother-in-law (whom I call "Amma" which means "mother" in several Indian languages") has a beautiful garden. We enjoy fresh coconuts, nutmeg, cherries, gooseberries, mangoes, bananas, beautiful orchids and a whole lot of lush flowering plants. At age 84, my "Amma" can share these delights with us from her garden. Amazing! But does it stress her? No. She has a way in which she organizes hands to harvest the fruits and water the plants. Across the street there is another home with ample land but not much of a garden. Why the contrast? The same soil, the same temperatures, the same atmosphere but two completely different results. How does Amma maximize her garden? The question leads her down memory lane. The coconut trees were planted about 40 years ago. The nutmeg tree many years before that. The mango tree and the cherry tree about 25 years ago and the gooseberry tree about 10 years ago. I take a lesson as I sit with Amma and listen. As with gardens, could congregations reap great harvests because someone committed to pray, plan, dream, set the ground and plant for the years ahead?

Let's keep our eyes on the goal. Let us keep our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith who for the joy set before him endured the cross. Hebrews 12: 2. Jesus kept his eye on the goal. He will help us keep our focus. It's a joy to be maximizing life together with you for His glory,

SPOTLIGHT ON MISSIONS Blanket Sunday

Blanket Sunday at Trinity is August 19th! The Church World Service Blankets+ Program is a worldwide effort to provide emergency supplies in the aftermath of a crisis. First blankets, then tents and food, then tools to rebuild and training for the future. As people recover from disaster or adjust to resettlement, the blankets provide comfort, and shelter, can be used as a sunshade or provide a dry place to sit and rest. Blankets are distributed wherever they are needed and may end up on the other side of the world, or in our own community. In 2017, over 1,500 blankets were distributed to people affected by the fall hurricanes. Church World Service is a collection of 37 different denominations, including the United Methodist Church. UMCOR relies on CWS as part of its disaster response program. This is just one of the ways in which we follow John Wesley's desire to put "faith and love into action."
