

From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear Trinity Family,

Spring is in the air! It already feels like India!! Did I hear our travelling folk from Florida say, "We're returning"? It is a true joy to wish each of you lots of sunshine, outdoor moments and happiness. As we approach another season of Easter, we can make it our prayer to know Christ and the power of his glorious resurrection.

We have truly been blessed with the gift of Pastor Rick Warren's, 40 Days of Prayer. God is using it to shape our prayer lives as a church. Vicky Forman writes, "Gary and I are really enjoying the 40 Days of Prayer." The nearly seventy individuals, consisting of youth and adults, are blessed with daily journaling, learning prayer disciplines and sharing in a small group. Thank you Pastor Peggy and table leaders! On another note, we are looking forward with much anticipation to Youth Sunday. It is going to be a refreshing morning of celebrating with, hearing from, and learning together in worship with our dynamic young people, Youth Director and adult volunteers. We are also truly thankful to God for the renovated Youth Room made possible by your support and prayers. A special thanks to our Trustees and Haley Warner for the work done together.

It was the famed preacher Charles Spurgeon who is attributed to have said that, "A lie can travel halfway around the world while the truth is putting on its shoes." We live in times where truth is on the balance. As we tune into our radios and televisions and move from channel to channel or catch the news on our handheld devices, we find ourselves in a media-world vying for our attention. It is at times amusing to note how the same incident can be presented completely differently from different points of view. The problem is not just about viewpoints, but about how the main points in the story are often manipulated on account of the political leanings of a reporter or a media house. In World War II, Winston Churchill made his now famous statement: "In war time, truth is so precious that she should always be attended by a bodyguard of lies." While Churchill's remark perhaps refers more to deception and subterfuge, it does, at the very least, imply that truth is such a precious commodity that it should be zealously guarded lest it fall into the wrong hands. ¹

The Resurrection narrative in the Bible gives us a window-view into how truth is challenged. In Matthew 27:62-64, the Bible records, "The next day, the one after Preparation Day, the chief priests and the Pharisees went to Pilate. "Sir," they said, "we remember that while he was still alive that deceiver said, 'After three days I will rise again.' So, give the order for the tomb to be made secure until the third day. Otherwise, his disciples may come and steal the body and tell the people that he has been raised from the dead. This last deception will be worse than the first."

This is a revealing record. The religious people of the day were expressing fear of potential lies and a bodyguard of lies. That was not a problem in itself. The problem was that they themselves had sought to rely on a bodyguard of lies as they presented the case against Jesus before the Sanhedrin. In Matthew 26:59 -60, the Bible records, "The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for false evidence against Jesus so that they could put Him to death. But they did not find any, though many false witnesses came forward." When I think of the contradiction of convictions in this conundrum, it reminds me of the quote, "If lying was a job, I know some people that would be billionaires." The tragedy in this case, or course, was that people who were to protect the truth by virtue of their religious calling, were in fact, abusing it. Did you notice according to Matthew's record that they had classified Jesus as "that deceiver".

Down through the centuries, the virgin birth, the cross and the resurrection, which are part of the core of our Christian beliefs, have been challenged by heresies and the onslaught of atheism, other philosophies and sadly, even Christian indifference. Would you pause and think for a moment? If all that the Bible claims about the resurrection can be proven false, we will certainly not have a trustworthy faith. On the other hand, if its claims can be supported by reliable evidence, we will have the most dependable bedrock of belief. Jesus, in His earthly ministry not only taught about truth,

not only pointed us to the truth, but embodied it in a unique fashion. He declared without hesitation, "I am the way, the truth and the life." John 14:6. In our Christian understanding of truth, we are presented with a great challenge in this claim of Jesus. What is the challenge? When we as God's children are tempted to either disregard, negotiate around or compromise the truth, we are not just dealing with principles, we are dealing with the very personhood of Christ. The next time you are tempted to compromise truth in your life, be it in the words you speak or don't speak, be it in your actions or in thoughts residing in the deepest recesses of your mind, remember this principle! A violation of truth by Christ-followers is a violation of the person of Christ.

As we consider the resurrection, the apostle Paul gives us a fascinating account concerning eye witnesses. In I Corinthians 15:6 he writes, "After that, He appeared to more than 500 of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep." This is an incredible declaration because Paul's listeners or readers were in a position to verify this claim with the witnesses who were still alive. I am not sure if you are aware that among the many theories that seek to discount or deny the resurrection of Christ is the proposition that the 500 witnesses probably had a hallucination. Lee Strobel (author of "The Case for Miracles" and many other books) states, "I went to a psychologist friend and said if 500 people claimed to see Jesus after he died, it was just a hallucination. He said, hallucinations are an individual event. If 500 people have the same hallucination, that's a bigger miracle than the resurrection."

Lee Strobel, a brilliant legal mind and a convert to Christ through a passionate cerebral search for the truth, is a compelling voice for us to consider. As we continue to think this Easter season, I want to invite you to remember that while the evidence for the resurrection is truly dependable, there is another aspect of the resurrection that is also powerfully compelling. It is the evidence of lives transformed by the Risen Christ.

In 1974, Charles Colson entered a guilty plea to Watergate-related charges. He entered Alabama's Maxwell prison in 1974 as a new Christian and as the first member of the Nixon administration to be incarcerated for Watergate-related charges. Colson had given his life to Christ a year before that. He served 7 months of a one -to-three-year sentence. After leaving prison, Colson founded Prison Fellowship Ministries in 1976, which since became the world's largest outreach to prisoners, ex-prisoners and their families. Colson says, "I know the resurrection is a fact, and Watergate proved it to me. How? Because 12 men testified they had seen Jesus raised from the dead, then they proclaimed that truth for 40 years, never once denying it. Everyone was beaten, tortured, stoned and put in prison. They would not have endured that if it weren't true. Watergate embroiled 12 of the most powerful men in the world-and they couldn't keep a lie for three weeks. You're telling me 12 apostles could keep a lie for 40 years? Absolutely impossible."




MAY 5 | MAY 19 | JUNE 2
