



From the Pastor's Heart

My dear Trinity Family,

Apart from all the happiness and laughter that surrounds our lives as a congregation, there are some special moments that especially make us smile – and learn from. I wish to share one such moment with you.

'Grandparents in prayer' is a special group at Trinity with a very precious mission. We live in times when our grandchildren are prone to be enticed by temptations, hurt by adult failures, manipulated by evil people, carried away by the waves of social media, confused about their self-worth - and sadly unsure at times of God's love for them. It is much to our dismay that very talented and gifted young lives are lost every day in a world of substance abuse and suicides. The growing years which were once upon a time, carefree have tragically become joy-free in the lives of some young people today.

In my years of serving as a pastor, I have come to believe that there is often a very special bond between grandparents and grandchildren. There may be many reasons for this. Here is one that Sam Levenson offers: "The reason grandparents and grandchildren get along so well is that they have a common enemy."

Keep smiling! If you are a grandparent with a passion for your grandchildren's spiritual and overall wellbeing, 'Grandparents in prayer' is a group I would encourage you to join.

On January 13, 2020, we were enjoying our time at the 'Grandparents in prayer' lunch hosted by Dr. Ron and Beth Sider. During our lunch gathering, Betty Winter told us about her grandson. After completing his duties as an acolyte one Sunday, he came to Betty with a big smile and said, "Nan, that's one more Sunday when I didn't burn the church down!"

As much as we laughed, that made me think. Especially in the light of our present conversations with regard to human sexuality as the United Methodist Church. Maybe he has a point we all must consider deeply. For a

church that has its universal symbols in the cross and the flame, we are called to live by God's love and God's truth. Love as reflected at Calvary. Truth as brought to us by the Holy Spirit from God's Holy Word. A church with an obsession for love and scant regard for God's truth will become *rudderless*. On the other hand, a church with an obsession for truth and scant regard for God's love will become *heartless*. Is there a way in which love and truth can walk hand in hand – and reflect God's grace and yearning for all people? The Lord Jesus embodied this perfectly and is therefore described as *full of grace and truth*. John 1: 14. Please note that the scripture does not say he had some of grace and some of truth. It affirms that He was full of grace and truth.

As a disciple of the Lord Jesus, I delight in our Lord's command to love everyone. If the question ever is, "Must I love everyone without discrimination or favor?" The resounding answer of the Bible is YES! That is, in fact a "no brainer". Moreover, it is a non-negotiable Scriptural standard. Jesus said in Mark 12:31: "The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." Yes. Love must be our native air – our second nature.

What I am concerned about on the other hand is the fact that Jesus measures *our love for him* by one important indicator. Guess what that is? Obedience. He said in John 14:15, "If you love me, obey my commands". As I speak with my friends across a spectrum of opinions about human sexuality, one of my appeals to them is, "Please do not interpret my understanding of Christian marriage (Based on our Lord Jesus' words in Matthew 19:4-6) as an intent to isolate, discriminate or alienate". Having served in the pastoral ministry for thirty years, having been with various kinds of people in their times of joys, pain and struggles and having travelled across cultures and spoken in global contexts, I can honestly say that I very much love people. I have been blessed to have friends of different nationalities, cultures, religions, sexual orientation and worldviews. I have friends who have agreed with me heartily and disagreed with me passionately – and we've still been friends! I have had friends who love spicy Indian chicken curry and those who can't stand it! Having said that, I remember the prayer that a little boy wrote to God, "Lord, I can't believe you can claim to love all the people in the world! I have four people in my family, and I find it impossible". Don't we all need grace to love more.

As you see my friend, my struggle in our present times is not about loving people unreservedly, it is rather about failing to love God as He expects me to. This struggle certainly has nothing to do with hate or phobias but has everything to do with love. A love for the God who died for me on the cross – and a love for the people He died for. A love for the One who created me – and a love for the ones He created. A love for each human being created with worth, beauty, gifts, graces – most of all his image. A love for each human being who has been endowed by the Creator with the inalienable rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. A love for God who is the very source of my breath, life, purpose, mission and salvation. My dilemma of love in the light of Jesus' call to obedience: Could I end up loving others more and God less?

Those of us who have seen our other acolytes carry the flame for the altar candles at church services, know exactly what he is talking about. The more I thought about his words, the more I was drawn to a lesson. He not only focuses on his God-given task as an acolyte, he and our other acolytes steward the light well!

Maybe his words hold out a challenge for us. Can we as United Methodists light our candles without "burning the church down"?

Praying with you and with much burden for our beloved Church and for all who are hurting in this present conversation. Let us not yield to panic but rather to prayer. Let us never forget that when God writes the last line in our corporate story, it will always be good. Let us in settled trust, give him our pen and paper.

LIFT CLASS

Strength-Training Program continues at Trinity!

Penn State Extension is offering a group-based strength-training program for inactive to moderately active adults aged 40 and older this winter and spring at Trinity UM.

"LIFT," which stands for Lifelong Improvements through Fitness Together, will be held Feb. 10 - April 1, 2020, Mondays and Wednesdays, 9:30 - 10:45 am in the Mt. Olivet Room. Participation may result in improvements in functional fitness or the ability to perform activities of daily living with ease.

"LIFT" sessions are held twice a week for one hour and fifteen minutes over the course of eight weeks and include an active warmup, strength-training exercises and a cool-down period. A weekly nutrition lesson is also part of the program.

Strength training offers physical, mental and emotional benefits including increased muscle mass and strength; improved bone density; reduced risk for osteoporosis and related fractures; reduced risk of diabetes, heart disease, arthritis, depression and obesity; and improved self-confidence, sleep and vitality.

Cost of the program is \$60. Some insurance policies may reimburse participants with 80 percent or better attendance; those attending should check with their insurance provider for more information.
