Forget yourselves long enough to lend a helping hand. Think of yourselves the way Christ Jesus thought of himself."

Yes! Think of yourself the way Christ thought of himself!

In other words, the challenge is this: Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus! (NIV)

What a tall call indeed! But that is God's standard and desire for us.

We are to set our eyes on Jesus (Hebrews 12: 2) and by setting our eyes on Him, we can seek to become a little more like Him.

During this Lenten season, would you make it your prayer to become a little more like Jesus everyday?

When I was serving in my first pastoral appointment in India in the early 1980's, there was a couple who brought their little boy to church every Sunday. On one Sunday, I had travelled to preach in another location. When the little boy entered the sanctuary and looked around for me, he was disappointed! He turned and asked, "Dad, Mom, where is Jesus today?"

When his parents told me what happened, there was a great new weight of responsibility laid upon my soul. I had never imagined that a little boy would liken me to Jesus in his mind.


The truth is - The Heavenly Father does want to liken us to Jesus!

Several HACC professors worked with us. One worked with us on electronics by demonstrating a robot. Another professor worked with us on engineering. Another professor who grew up in Hong Kong worked on art and math. She enjoyed working with the boys and brought a friend, who was a doctor from Hong Kong, to work with us. Many people helped us work on merit badges.

We worked on many service projects. We picked up trash as we hiked, walked in New Cumberland, Wildwood Park, Harrisburg and on sides of roads. I have a picture of Marcia Haller and Mark working on the side of a road. We worked at the Neighborhood Center in Harrisburg. We also helped out at the church.

We went on many hikes and camping trips, even one backpacking trip. The boys were always accompanied by their father or older brother. During camping trips we would go on skunk hunts. I don't know what we would have done if we would have found one. We had a good time, but always learned about camping and cooking over a camp fire.

I enjoyed working with Troop 269 and watching them grow into young men. I still think about them and look at pictures that were taken. After I retired, Jerry Davis took over as Scout Master, and now Jason Arnold leads the boys.
